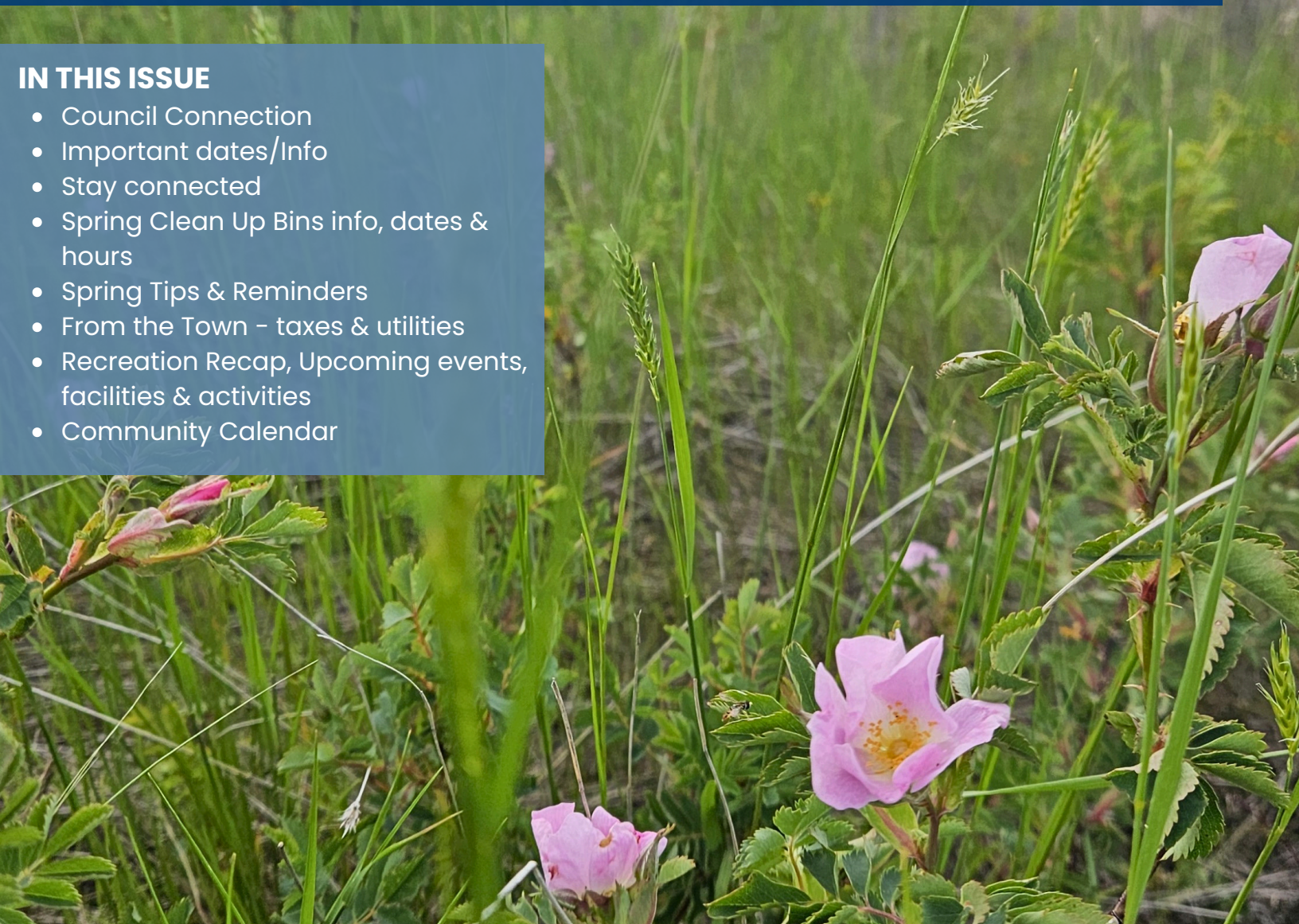

COUNCIL CONNECTION

Council meetings are open to the public. Meetings are normally held the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month. If a Statutory Holiday falls on a regularly scheduled Council meeting Monday, the Council meeting will be held on the Tuesday. Unscheduled Special Meetings are advertised in advance for public attendance.

UPDATES & INFORMATION

2026 CENSUS

2026 is a Census of Population year. Invitation letters will be sent in early May requesting Canadian households to complete the questionnaire online. Completing the census helps ensure your community receives its fair share. Municipalities receive annual Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant from the Province of Saskatchewan using calculation based on census populations. Your response helps ensure our community receives the funding, services, and infrastructure it needs.

Every resident counted brings dollars to our community.

SPRING CLEAN UP BINS

To ensure the success and continuation of this service, a staff member will be on site during open hours to greet residents, obtain resident information (name, address, license plate number) and ensure items are acceptable for disposal.

BYLAW AMENDMENTS

Any amendments to Bylaws are reviewed by Council at Council Meetings through three readings, which allows opportunity for any required changes to be made. Notification of upcoming bylaw amendment readings is communicated on Voyent Alert.

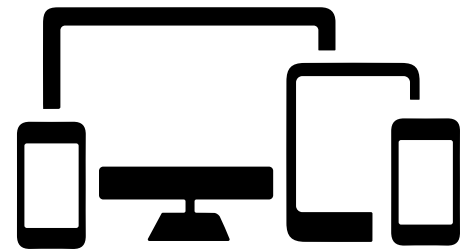

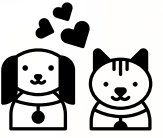

Spring Tips & Reminders

Pets

Reminder to Pet Owners:

- Pets must be licensed through the Town as per the Bylaw No.11-2017 Dog and Cat Control. The license fee is \$20 for neutered pets and \$40 for those not neutered for the lifetime of the pet. Licensing forms are available on the Town website: pilotbutte.ca/pets



- Pets must be on leash at all times when outside your fenced yard.
- Please clean up after your pets on public and private property. This includes parks, pathways and on your property to ensure the smell doesn't become a nuisance as the weather warms.
- Please be respectful of neighbours by ensuring dogs are not left outside barking continuously.

Street Cleaning

As the snow melts and the streets dry, street sweeping will take place throughout Town. Please watch the Town's social media, website & notification systems, such as **Voyent Alert**, for notification of planned street sweeping days so you can ensure your vehicle is not parked on the street during those times.

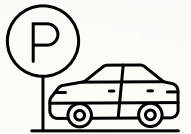

Boulevard Parking Restrictions waived from May 1 to October 31

From May 1 to October 31st, the 72 hour parking restriction on the boulevard is waived. This means legally registered vehicles may park on the boulevard portion of a property during this period.

ATV Registration

All ATV's being operated on Town property must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte. ATV registrations must be renewed annually, the renewal fee is \$15 per plate.

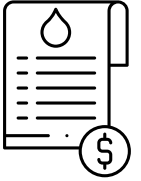

Utility Notices & Payments

Utilities are billed on the first business day of the month for the previous month's usage. Payments are due at the end of the billing month. Interest will be charged at the rate of 1.5% per month on unpaid balances. Please plan accordingly when making online payments, as it can take up to 3-5 days to be received and processed.



Payment Options:

- Cash - at the Town Office
- Credit Card - online through OptionPay at pilotbutte.ca/optionpay or at the Town Office (OptionPay fees apply)
- Debit at the Town Office
- Online banking as a bill payment
 - **E-Transfer is NOT a payment option for Utility payments

Property Taxes

The property tax year is from January 1st – December 31st of the current year. Property tax notices are sent by the end of May and are due December 31st of the year in which the notice is issued. Any amount unpaid by December 31st will be carried forward to the new year and will be subject to a 1.5% penalty on the first of every month thereafter until paid. Discounts may be available for early payment- please refer to the discount information on the Tax Notice.

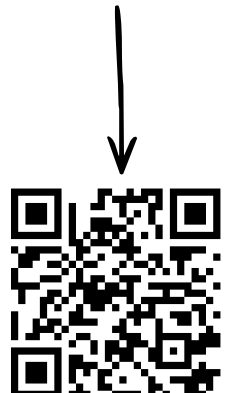

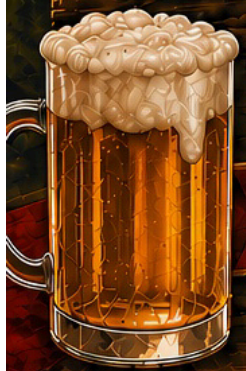

Book Review by Small Towns are the Life

Finding Flora by Elinor Florence. A first-rate Canadian tale.



Small Towns are the Life

The book opens with a young Scottish woman taking desperate measures to exit a train in the cold dark of a prairie night near the foothills of the Rockies. In the early 1900's Alberta was on the cusp of becoming a province and the Canadian government was looking to populate its empty spaces by offering land to homesteaders. Any man with ambition could claim 160 acres by agreeing to live on the land and break several acres to crop. You needed only enough funds to purchase materials, livestock, grubstake and equipment until such time as the farm became self-supporting. Single women were not allowed to take advantage of this opportunity unless they were widows with children. The book follows Flora Craigie as she lucks into the one loophole in the program and there begins her great adventure.

Flora meets several of the local characters, including some women farmers like herself, and others who resent her audacity in taking up farmland that a man might have had. She is under much pressure to surrender her claim to a man. Any man. The book records Flora's trials, heartbreaks and triumphs in finding herself alone in an alien landscape having to rely largely on her own physical, emotional and mental strengths to prove to herself and to others that she belongs in that company of "homesteaders." The book is a testament to the courage and fortitude of women who continue to prevail against societal obstacles and forge their own way.

The characters are well-drawn and the book is written with an economy of language which makes it an easy and enjoyable read. There are unanswered questions in regard to some details but these do not detract from the story. I love reading Canadian and, as a window to a period and a place in Canadian history, this book does well. While the book is situated in west central Alberta, the author grew up in the parklands of Saskatchewan; her love of the natural beauty of that prairie landscape (the flora?) is evident throughout the narrative.

I enjoyed this book enough that I plan to source Ms. Florence's two other offerings, Bird's Eye View and Wildwood.

While our local library does not have a copy of Finding Flora currently in stock, Connie has signed up for the first one that comes available.

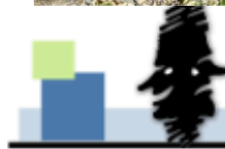

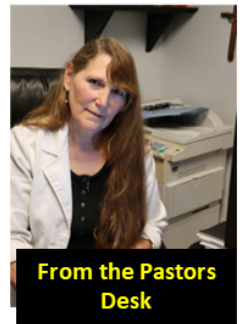

Landscape Deposit

Did you complete landscaping this year?

If your house was built in 2023 the summer of 2026 will represent your last opportunity to take advantage of the Homeowners Landscape Deposit.

The landscape deposit is refundable within 3 years of the date of the permit approval. This is a minimum landscaping deposit- all of the front, back and side yards must have the bare ground covered with either grass or landscape material to prevent water erosion, blowing sand, or the unsightliness of weeds. No other landscape features are required to qualify for the rebate, though we love to see fences, flowers, trees, bushes, water, boulders and anything else your imagination can provide. The Town appreciates all those residents who take pride in their yards and make them beautiful! Please note that your landscaping may not change the lot levels in any way that will have a negative effect on your neighbours' properties or on public lands.

When you are ready, send pictures of your yard from every perimeter to permits@pilotbutte.ca. I will make an appointment to come out and view the finished yard. Inspections are usually on Thursday afternoons. The Town will send a cheque in the amount of \$1,000 after the Council Meeting next following the inspection providing all requirements are met.

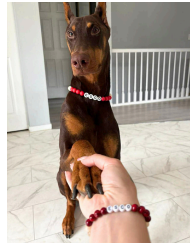

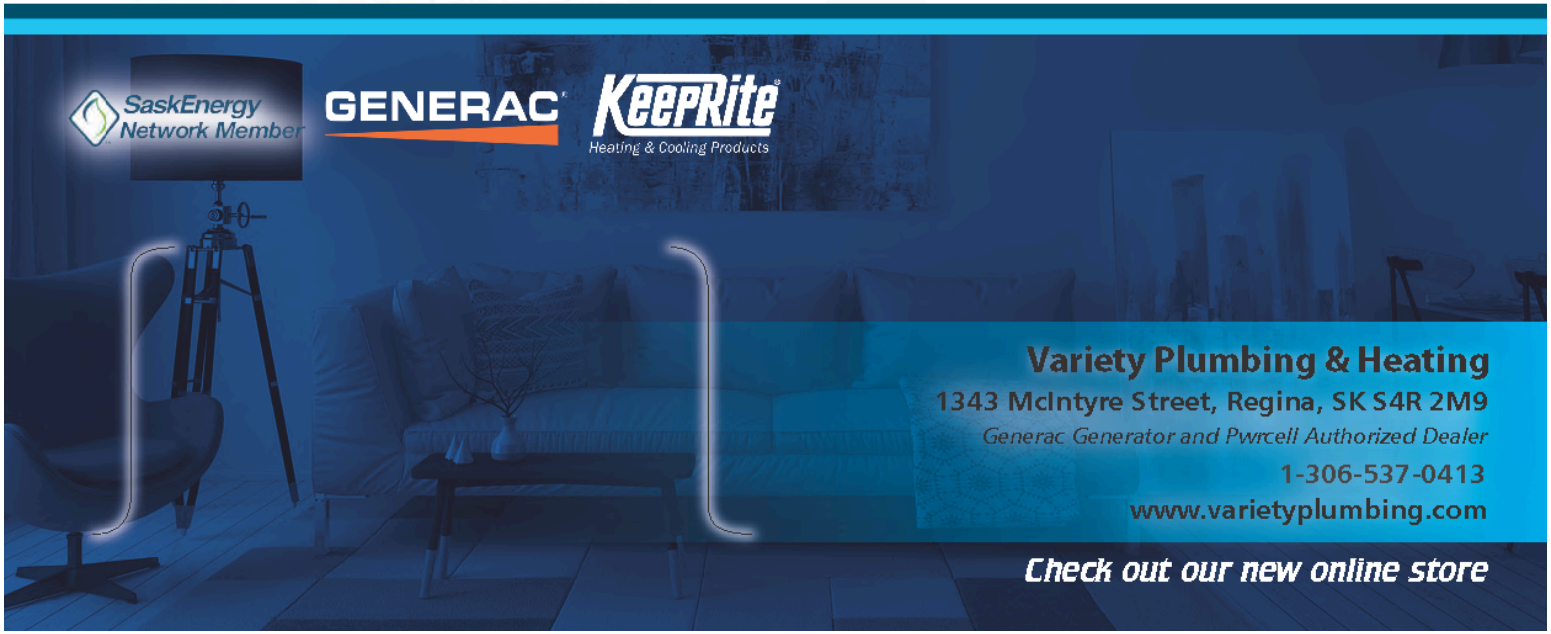
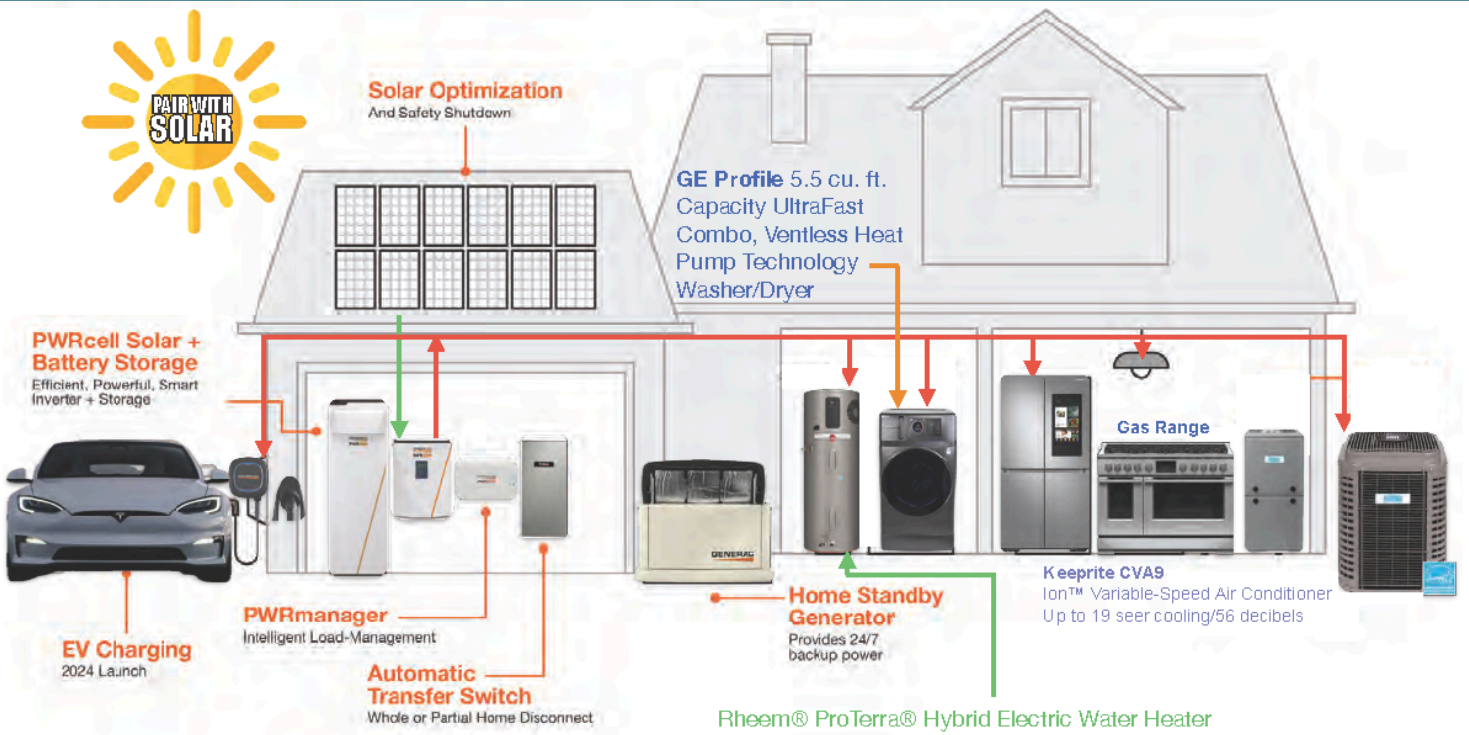
