2025 BUDGET

Council has been working on establishing and completing the 2025 budget. Once the budget is completed the mill rate will be set. Property tax notices will be prepared and sent out by the end of May. Council is hosting The Butte Budget event on April 26th from 1-4pm at the Recreation Centre Lobby to provide residents with information about the budget and future capital budget projects.

2025 ASSESSMENT NOTICES

The 2025 Assessment Notices were mailed/emailed in March. With 2025 being a Revaluation year (required by provincial legislation that the assessed value of all properties within Saskatchewan be updated every four years), all residents will receive an Assessment Notice. The Assessment Notice is not to be confused with a Tax Notice, which is mailed/emailed in May advising property owners of the 2025 property taxes.

Town of Pilot Butte ATV Registration

What You Need To Know...

- All ATV's being operated on town property must be registered & display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
- Golf Carts are *NOT* permitted.
- Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum of 30km/h within town limits.
- The Town recommends residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from place of residence.
- Riders must be 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license OR
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are *NOT* permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please follow and obey all posted signs.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.

• The annual renewal fee is \$15 per plate. You must submit current proof of liability insurance with your payment.

The annual renewal fee of \$15 per plate can be paid at the Town office or sent by e-transfer to *pbetransfer@sasktel.net*

If you are paying by e-transfer please include in the memo "2025 ATV Renewal" and the plate number(s) that you are renewing.

Proof of current liability insurance can be emailed to *general@pilotbutte.ca*.

Once payment and proof of current Liability insurance is received, you will be mailed your 2025 Sticker.
