Landscape Deposit

If your house was built in 2022 the summer of 2025 will represent your last opportunity to take advantage of the Builders Landscape Deposit.

The landscape deposit is refundable within 3 years of the date of the permit approval. This is a minimum landscaping deposit- all of the front, back and side yards must have the bare ground covered with either grass or landscape material to prevent water erosion, blowing sand, or the unsightliness of weeds. No other landscape features are required to qualify for the rebate, though we love to see fences, flowers, trees, bushes, water, boulders and anything else your imagination can provide. The Town appreciates all those residents who take pride in their yards and make them beautiful! Please note that your landscaping may not change the lot levels in any way that will have a negative effect on your neighbours' properties or on public lands.

When you are ready, send pictures of your yard from every perimeter to permits@pilotbutte.ca. I will make an appointment to come out and view the finished yard. Inspections are usually on Thursday afternoons. The Town will send a cheque in the amount of \$1,000 after the Council Meeting next following the inspection providing all requirements are met.

I look forward to a great summer season of lovely yard inspections.



Town of Pilot Butte ATV Registration

What You Need To Know...

- All ATV's being operated on town property must be registered & display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
- Golf Carts are *NOT* permitted.
- Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum of 30km/h within town limits.
- The Town recommends residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from place of residence.
- Riders must be 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license OR
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are *NOT* permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please follow and obey all posted signs.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.

• The annual renewal fee is \$15 per plate. You must submit current proof of liability insurance with your payment.

If you are paying by e-transfer please include in the memo "2025 ATV Renewal" and the plate number(s) that you are renewing.

Once payment and proof of current Liability insurance is received, you will be mailed your 2025 Sticker.

3 Keep fire hydrants clear of snow

In an emergency situation, every second matters! An inaccessible snow covered/blocked fire hydrant can impede the process. Help keep our community safe by keeping fire hydrants accessible and clear of snow.

O Please do not put snow from your driveway or front sidewalk onto or blocking a fire hydrant.

Clearing a path to and approximately 3ft around the fire hydrant allows space for the fire department to access it and work.

If you see a fire hydrant that is covered in snow or inaccessible and are able to help remove the snow, we appreciate it!

T Town crews check and clear fire hydrants, but if you see one that is inaccessible and aren't able to clear it, please let us know.

The Town appreciates residents contributions to keeping our community safe!

4 Sign up for e-notices

The Town has implemented a new program for providing e-notices for taxes & utilities. Notifications will still be sent by email, with a link to sign in to a secure website to view your current notice, payment receipts, utility and tax notices, as well as previous notices (starting from February 1, 2024) and current balances!

7 Coyotes safety tips

- Keep unattended cats and dogs indoors or in completely enclosed runs, especially at night. Do not assume that a fence will keep a coyote out of your backyard.
- Never feed coyotes, deer, or other wildlife. Feeding wild animals may endanger your family and neighbours as it lures coyotes into neighbourhoods.
- Remove coyote attractants, including pet food, dirty barbecue grills, and unsecured trash or compost.
- If you encounter a coyote, yell, clap your hands, whistle, and try to make yourself look large.

 - What have been the benefits to growing up in rural/small-town Saskatchewan? What opportunities would you suggest
 that would make Pilot Butte a better place to live and work?
 - A short video on what youth leadership in a small town means to you.
 - Submit a copy of your most recent high-school transcript.
- Submit with letter of reference.
- Attend the interview on the pre-determined date.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applications due by May 1, 2025
- Interviews will take place on a to-be-determined date.
- When applicants drop off or e-mail in their application forms, they will be assigned a time for an interview, which will be held in the Town Office Council Chambers.
- Please note: If no qualified applicant is found, the scholarship may not necessarily be awarded.

"Adventures in snow-shoeing" or "How I learned to stay upright"

When the Recreation Department announced that the Town now carries various sizes of snow-shoes and was making them available for residents to use, I recognized an opportunity. I had watched many movies and documentaries where some intrepid adventurer snowshoes confidently through a frozen landscape; hunting, or evading bad guys, whatever. Didn't look too challenging. I thought I'd like to try that. The Recreation Department kindly outfitted me with a set of snow-shoes and poles all tidy in a neat carry bag.

I was set!

The very next weekend, I ventured out on a frosty (-24C) Sunday over to White Butte Trails to try out my new equipment. With fingers rapidly losing flexibility in the brisk wind, I buckled the shoes onto my boots and was away. Of course, you can't snowshoe on the ski trails, so I got a rhythm going on the main track – stride forward, cuss a little when the shoes keep falling off the boots, swing the poles, repeat. I figured once I was challenged a little with some deeper snow my boots might more firmly fit into the shoes. So I left the path as soon as I could and headed into virgin snow. And over I went. Struggled to my feet, one of the shoes was still stuck in the snow, thank heaven for the poles. I'm 70 and not that limber any more so getting up again takes a minute or two. But there you go! Up again. Boot back in the shoe. The snowshoes sink a lot farther into the sugary snow than I thought they would and are harder to lift out again than my own boots. But I persevere. And fall over twice more. Good thing this is an easy winter sport, eh? Soft snow to land in and not going very fast. It quickly became clear that the smooth forward momentum I was striving for was beyond me. Even in my heavy chore mitts my hands were freezing on the poles and I was NOT having any fun. I gave up and schlepped back to the car in defeat.

Fast forward a week. Now I am visiting my daughter who has a little farm on a hillside in the Qu'Appelle Valley not far out of Lumsden. And she offers to take me snowshoeing. I have brought the neat little kit from Pilot Butte just in case. And you know what? Turns out that I am a complete ninny when it comes to putting on those snowshoes - those are RATCHETING buckles. No wonder I couldn't keep the darned things on my feet. Rachel rolls her eyes fondly at me (she is very tolerant of her mother's short-comings - no pun intended). My grandson Tyler joins us and we set off up into the hills. Today it is only -15c in the sunshine though there is still a brisk wind, and we swing easily along the high hills dipping into several sharp little ravines where the banks loom over us. The view from the top - all the fresh snow gleaming across the valley - is an added bonus to the day. I am having a marvelous time! I still don't think I would try running in them like the guys in the movies, but it tums out that snowshoeing is FUN!

So, as mentioned, any resident can rent snowshoes for himself or his family for the weekend by calling or dropping into the Recreation office any weekday. There is no fee, but there is a form to sign and your credit card number will be taken in case of unforeseen circumstances.
