TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE - LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

- The Town of Pilot Butte is offering one (1) \$1,000 scholarship to any Pilot Butte Grade12 graduating student.

Eligibility

- Students must be a resident of the Town of Pilot Butte.

 - b. What have been the benefits to growing up in rural/small-town Saskatchewan? What opportunities would you suggest that would make the Town of Pilot Butte a better place to live and work?
 - c. A short video on what youth leadership in a small town means to you.
- Submit a copy of your most recent high-school transcript.
- Submit with letter of reference.
- Attend the interview on the pre-determined date.

SASKATCHEWAN SAFETY FUND GRANT

The Town of Pilot Butte is excited to announce the successful award of grant funding from the Government of Saskatchewan in support of our "Walk A Butte" project.

In the coming weeks, you will see the installation of <u>2 new Pedestrian Crosswalks</u> and <u>2 Electronic Speed Indicator Signs</u> along 5th Avenue.

The Town has identified that we would require a multi-functional approach to improve safety and reduce speed along main arteries in and out of town. The support and funding by the Government of Saskatchewan helps our community achieve our goal objectives and provide safe roadways for our residents.

The "Walk A Butte Project" is a multi-year plan that will be phased in over a number of years. The Town of Pilot Butte will continue to apply for future grant opportunities that support road safety within our community.







This winter has been unusually cold. Although we have experienced a couple weeks of mild weather, this also increases the high chance of freezing water services. The Town has notified the homes that are at the highest risk of freezing and asked them to take measures to prevent that. If you have had your water service freeze in the past and you are wondering if you might be at risk this winter you may email the Town at general@pilotbutte.ca.

The Town has also changed its policy regarding the thawing of water services. If you have been notified of the risk of freezing and your water service freezes the Town will now be charging a fee to thaw your service.

SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage it is the responsibility of the property owner to contact the Town recommended Plumber (Roto Rooter 306-359-3996) to ensure location of the blockage or break is clearly defined. Video inspection footage will be required. A plumber must video each affected line to determine where the blockage is located.

The property Owner is responsible for the cost of maintenance or repair of the line from the building structure right up to and including the tap connecting to the sewer main, including any blockages, breakages or collapses. The Town of Pilot Butte is responsible for a failure at the main line, which is owned by the Town of Pilot Butte. If a blockage originates from the residence or business, the Owner will be responsible for the costs associated with clearing the line. Tree roots, or any other impediments, originating on private property, which affect the pipe's integrity on Town-owned property, are the responsibility of the Owners.

Sewer line back-ups and blockages can be caused by a variety of issues including but not limited to: Excessive grease, root infiltration of line, infrequent use (frozen lines), breaks in the lateral sewer line and obstructions. Obstructions may include, but are not limited to: rags/fabric, 'flushable' wipes, household debris, personal hygiene products, and diapers, toys, disinfecting wipes or paper towels.

It is the responsibility of the property owner to investigate and arrange for the clearing of blockages as well as the repair to pipe defect on their property.

It is the Town's responsibility to repair pipe defect on Town property.










Town of Pilot Butte ATV Registration



- and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
- Golf Carts are NOT permitted
- Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum of 30km/h within town limits.
- The Town recommends residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from place of residence.
- Riders must be 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are *NOT* permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please follow and obey all posted signs.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.

- The annual renewal fee is \$15 per plate. You must submit current proof of liability insurance with your payment.

2023 Assessment Notices To Be Mailed/Emailed

2023 Assessment Notices will be mailed/emailed out within the next few weeks. The Assessment Notice is not to be confused with a tax notice (which is mailed/emailed out in May). If you receive an assessment notice, this means you took out a building permit for a new home, garage, addition, renovation or demolition or if the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) had a callback notification in their files.

For 2023, most residents will receive an assessment notice as SAMA did a "Reinspection" of all properties in Pilot Butte. Please see their general information below for further explanation. Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency determines assessments for the municipality. You can also access assessments at www.sama.sk.ca and click the SAMAView link. If you receive an assessment notice and have questions, please feel free to contact SAMA at 306-924-8080 or the Town Office at 306-781-4547 and we would be happy to help you.

In 2022, Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) did reinspections (physically or via updated documentation from the resident) on all homes in Pilot Butte. The last reinspection that was done In Pilot Butte was in the mid 1980's. Much has changed in homes over the past 40 years.

Here is some general information from SAMA on the reinspection process that was done in Pilot Butte in 2022 for the 2023 Assessment year:

Reinspections are when we physically visit every building in the Town, review all ag land records, fixing everything that has become out of date. Reinspections are one of SAMAs central legislative obligations, in order to maintain an equitable assessment base. We have been performing 5-10 municipal reinspections every summer. In the year following a reinspection, every property receives a new assessment notice.

Reinspections are sometimes confused with Revaluations. The 2021 Revaluation was the update to the market value of property that occurs every four years in all municipalities in the province. (All values were adjusted to reflect a new date of valuation January 1, 2019 instead of January 1, 2015). Reinspections are updating physical data through inspection, while revaluations are updating market value with no physical review of the properties. The Revaluation was completed for the 2021 taxation year.

According to our records, Pilot Butte was last reinspected in the 1980's. We are striving to reduce the time between full reinspections, as 30 years is too long to maintain accurate data. Many properties in town are newer than that and have been visited since that time, and we have done 2 special projects to capture basement rooms which were successful so we know we are not out of date on that. But there are likely some older properties that should be reviewed to have their condition updated (and increased).

Changes you would expect:

- Outbuildings, decks, or renovations previously missed from the assessment may be added to the roll.
- The condition of residential property will be updated compared to the existing SAMA record (general good maintenance vs. disrepair will be recognized).
- Land size, civic addresses, legal land descriptions, can be reviewed and corrected.
- All property reviewed for correctness including commercial property.

Public Relations:

SAMA sent a letter to all property owners in April of 2022 explaining the reinspection, and inviting people to report their property details. They reviewed the information on the returned form, visited the property, and left a door hanger with contact information notifying property owners if they were not home. If an individual was not comfortable with that process they could request that an appointment be made for their inspection.






