# Tips from the Town

# 1 Register for VoyentAlert

The Town of Pilot Butte uses the Voyent Alert! notification system to keep residents informed on day-to-day notices, general information and critical information. Examples of notices sent using this system include but are not limited to town events, road closures, policy or procedure changes which effect residents, local emergency alerts, as well as reminders for collection pick up days. Residents can choose to personalize their preferences to specific topics of interest or all notice notifications.

# 2 Follow us on Facebook

Follow our Social Media accounts on Facebook and Instagram for updates, information, current and upcoming programming, events/activities and more! This is a great way to keep in-the-know of all things Pilot Butte. Search for "Town of Pilot Butte" and give us a follow.

# 3 Add driveway markers to your property

Driveway markers are a great way to mark your driveway in preparation of winter for snow removal and help our operators effectively navigate the grader and know where the grass and property lines are. These can be found at local hardware stores.

# 4 Vote at the Municipal Election

Election Day is Wednesday, November 13th from 9am – 8pm in the Pilot Butte Recreation Complex in the Community Hall. Advance Polls will be held on: Saturday, October 26 from 1-4pm at Council Chambers/Town Office & Tuesday, November 5th from 5-8pm at Council Chambers/Town Office

# 5 Ensure you are aware of parking restrictions

Parking Restrictions are in effect as of November 1st. No person shall park a vehicle on a highway or boulevard for any period of time exceeding seventy-two (72) consecutive hours. The 72-hour restriction on the boulevard portion shall be waived from May 1 to October 31 of each year for legally registered vehicles. Only vehicles that are in daily use are allowed to be parked on the boulevard. Please ensure that campers, boats, trailers, or any other items owned are not stored on the boulevard as of November 1st.

# 6 Sign up for e-notices

The Town has implemented a new program for providing e-notices for taxes & utilities. Notifications will still be sent by email, with a link to sign in to a secure website to view your current notice, payment receipts, utility and tax notices, as well as previous notices (starting from February 1, 2024) and current balances!

# **Voter Information**

#### Who Can Vote?

- You are a Canadian citizen;
- You will be 18 years of age or will attain the full age of 18 years on or before election day;
- You will have resided for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election in or on land now in the Town of Pilot Butte; or
- You will have been the owner for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election of
  assessable land situated in the municipality or of land now in the municipality; and
- You have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

#### Voter's Registration Form – What is This Form For?

- The town does not have a voter's list so every voter **MUST** fill out a Voter's Registration Form in order to receive a ballot and vote for their candidate.
- To make voting quick and easy, it is highly recommended that you print and fill out your Voter's Registration Form prior to coming to the poll and then bring it with you to the poll filled out **BUT NOT SIGNED**.
  - PLEASE DO NOT SIGN THE FORM IN ADVANCE AS THE SIGNING <u>NEEDS</u> TO BE WITNESSED BY A DEPUTY RETURNING OFFICER AT THE POLL
- The Voter's Registration Form Form R, can be found on the Town website or it can be emailed to you or phone the Town Office to pick up a copy. Registration Forms will also be available at the Advance Polls and Regular Polls.

#### What Identification Do I Need to Vote?

- A government-issued photo ID that shows your name and address (does not need to indicate physical address); or
- Two pieces of government-issued ID one that shows your name and another that shows your name and address

Bylaw 13-2011

Parking of RV, Utility Trailers, Vehicles and Recreational Vehicles Storage

No person shall park a vehicle on a highway or boulevard for any period of time exceeding seventy-two (72) consecutive hours. The 72-hour restriction on the boulevard portion shall be waived from May 1 to October 31 of each year for legally registered vehicles.

Only vehicles that are in daily use are allowed to be parked on the boulevard. Please ensure that campers, boats, trailers, or any other items owned are not stored on the boulevard as of November 1st. Parking enforcement will take place on November 4th and vehicles, boats, trailers, etc. in violation will be towed.
