BOULEVARD PARKING

"Winter is Coming, YO HO, YO HO; Winter is coming with ice and snow" - old English folk song

THAT means that, for the winter season, residents must remove trailers and any other items stored or otherwise parked on the boulevards. Vehicles that are being used every day may be parked on the boulevards for periods no longer than 72 hours. The 72- hour restriction does not mean that you drive your vehicle around the block and re-park it every 72 hours. It means that any vehicle not in regular use should not be parked on the boulevard for the winter months. The boulevards are provided to you for your convenience but they are Town property and, for ease of snow removal, the Town requires them to be unobstructed for the winter.

Vehicles and/or Properties in Violation will be ticketed by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer. If not moved in accordance with the bylaw, the vehicle may be towed.

In the event of imminent snowfall, the Town also asks residents and visitors not to park on the pavement where there is a curb. It is much harder to plow the streets effectively when the grader has to navigate around parked vehicles. Please remember that there is NEVER parking allowed on the travelled portion of the road where no curb exists.

The Town thanks you in advance for your cooperation and appreciates your commitment to making Pilot Butte the BEST town in which to live.

Also, for those who phone the Town Office with complaints, please note that the website contains a complaint form, as all complaints should be presented to the Town in writing.

SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused** (at the discretion of the Director of Public Works & Maintenance Operations) if this condition is not met. A **maintenance man is on call after**

E-MAIL DELIVERY OF UTILITY AND TAX *EBILLS NOW* AVAILABLE! NOW EVEN EASIER TO SIGN UP!

The Town of Pilot Butte now offers residents the opportunity to receive municipal notices as attachments in an e-mail rather than by regular mail. The service is a great convenience for those on the go!

If you would like your utility, tax, assessment and/or any other town notices emailed to you, please fill out the *Consent Form and note your account number for your utility and/or tax account. The form now has a check box for convenience.*

In 2017, all residents will receive an assessment notice. This notice will also be emailed if you have submitted an authorization form. If you do not want the assessment notice emailed and you have submitted an authorization form, please email the townofpilotbutte@sasktel.net to have that form sent via regular mail.

You can drop off the completed form at the Town Office or email it back to pbadminassist3@sasktel.net. Thank you. Forms with the check box not checked will not be acknowledged so please be sure you have filled out the form correctly and checked off the box. Thank you.

Consent to the use of e-mail for the delivery of municipal notices includes agreement with the following:

- A. Failure to receive an e-mailed municipal notice does not release the resident from their responsibility to pay any charges specified on the notice, or any penalties which may be incurred by late payment;
- B. I will inform the Town of Pilot Butte of any change in my e-mail address as soon as possible, to prevent the misdirection of notices and reduce the risk of my not receiving a notice; and
- C. I may withdraw from e-mail delivery at any time. To do so I will inform the Town of Pilot Butte and all notices which were previously e-mailed to me will be sent by regular mail.

Drinking Water Quality and Compliance

The Water Security Agency and the Ministry of Environment requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Minister's Order or Permit to Operate a waterworks. The following is a summary of the **Town of Pilot Butte's** water quality and sample submission compliance record for the **year of 2016**. This report was completed on **7-Jan-2017**. Readers should refer to Water Security Agency's "Municipal Drinking Water Quality Monitoring Guidelines, June 2015, EPB 502" for more information on minimum sample submission requirements. Permit requirements for a specific waterworks may require more sampling than outlined in the department's monitoring guidelines. If consumers need more information on the nature and significance of specific water tests, for example, "what is the significance of selenium in a water supply", more detailed information is available from: http://www.hc-sc.gc.ca/ewh-semt/pubs/water-eau/index e.html .

The owner/operator is responsible to ensure that 100 per cent of all bacteriological samples are submitted as required. All waterworks are required to submit samples for bacteriological water quality, the frequency of monitoring depends on the population served by the waterworks.

A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual OR 0.5 mg/L total chlorine residual is required at all times throughout the distribution system unless otherwise approved. A proper chlorine submission is defined as a bacteriological sample submission form with both the free and total chlorine residual fields filled out. An adequate chlorine is a result that indicates that the chlorine level is above the regulated minimums. An adequate chlorine may be counted even if the chlorine results were submitted incorrectly. A waterworks is required to submit chlorine residual test results on every bacteriological sample they submit.

A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual is required for water entering the distribution system. Tests are normally performed on a daily basis by the waterworks operator and are to be recorded in operation records. This data includes the number of free chlorine residual tests performed, the overall range of free chlorine residual (highest and lowest recorded values) and the number of tests and percentage of results not meeting the minimum requirement of 0.1 mg/L free chlorine residual.

Turbidity is a measure of water treatment efficiency. Turbidity measures the "clarity" of the drinking water and is generally reported in Nephelometric Turbidity Units (NTU). All waterworks are required to monitor turbidity at the water treatment plant. The frequency of measurement varies from daily for small systems to continuous for larger waterworks.

Substances within the chemical health category may be naturally occurring in drinking water sources or may be the result of human activities. These substances may represent a long-term health risk if the Maximum Acceptable Concentration (MAC) or Interim Maximum Acceptable Concentration (IMAC) is exceeded. All drinking water supplies are required to monitor for substances in the Chemical-Health category, the frequency of monitoring depends on the population served by the waterworks. Some waterworks will add fluoride to drinking water as a means to aid in the prevention of dental decay.

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for SE's General Chemical category once every two years if a ground water source or once per three months every second year if a surface water or blended surface/groundwater source. The General Chemical category includes analysis for alkalinity, bicarbonate, calcium, carbonate, chloride, conductivity, hardness (as CaCO₃), magnesium, sodium, sulphate and total dissolved solids.

The last sample for General Chemical analysis was required in **2016** and submitted on **19-Jan-2016**. Sample results indicated that there were no exceedences of the provincial aesthetic objectives for the General Chemical category.

*Objectives apply to certain characteristics of or substances found in water for human consumptive or hygienic use. The presence of these substances will affect the acceptance of water by consumers and/or interfere with the practice of supplying good quality water. Compliance with drinking water aesthetic objectives is not mandatory as these objectives are in the range where they do not constitute a health hazards. The aesthetic objectives for several parameters (including hardness as CaCO₃ magnesium, sodium and total dissolved solids) consider regional differences in drinking water sources and quality.

Sask Power now has an online reporting system for a street light that is out. If you see that a street light is out please go to http://www.saskpower.com/accounts-and-services/servicerequests/report-streetlight-troubles/ and follow their easy to use map tool, as noted.

Once you have reported this outage, you will receive a reference number. Please make note of this number. If the street lamp is not repaired within 2 weeks, please phone the Sask Power service desk, supply your reference number and they should advise when you may expect to have the lamp repaired.

How to Use the Tool

Use the map to locate the streetlight you would like to report. Streetlights are represented by orange light bulbs.

JANUARY!

Happy New Year! Winter has been a cold one so far but it has been a wonderful opportunity for the children at preschool to observe, investigate, experiment and analyze the many wonders of this season!

What happens when snow is left indoors? What is snow made of? What melts snow and ice better—salt or water and why? These were just a few of the scientific discoveries the children participated in this month. We also explored winter activities and even had an indoor snowball toss with cotton balls and went "skating" on wax paper sheets!

An interesting event occurred at preschool that I just have to share with you! One day the children were introduced to the term "hibernation" at Circle Time and sorted animal and insect toys into two categories: Hibernates or Doesn't Hibernate. One of the toys was a ladybug. At Snack time I suddenly heard the exclamations of several preschoolers "She's not hibernating! She's not hibernating!". To my surprise a tiny ladybug was crawling across the floor. Many confused eyes were upon me now as I scrambled to explain this one!

But it turned out to be a great opportunity for the children and Mrs. Marshall to figure out why this lady bug was STILL awake and our research on the Ipad concluded that lady bugs don't hibernate in a warm building. Not sure how she made it in here but we then spent some time deciding how to take care of her until spring and the nearest potted plant became her new home! With more help from our Ipad research we discovered she only needs to drink water in the winter. It suggested a moistened raisin (it acts like a sponge) so the children placed one beside her and each day we check in on our little guest to see how she's doing. Until next month stay warm!

Starting in March, the RM of Edenwold will be asking ratepayers to, once again, share their vision for the future. Public consultations will be held via stakeholder engagement meetings and online surveys/ questionnaires leading to an update of the Official Community Plan.



"Public meetings will be the first of many steps to engage our residents and businesses, in both our rural and urban areas," says Senior Municipal Planner Jana Jedlic. Ratepayers are also encouraged to write letters and send emails to their councillors with their future hopes for the RM. The current Official Community Plan was released in 2010 and the RM has seen exponential growth since.

"We want to hear what is working, what people like and what changes or types of growth they want to see in and for the future," says Jedlic. "The OCP will frame the vision for the RM, which will be implemented through the regulations in the zoning bylaw."

On the path

More walking paths are coming for Emerald Park.

"Emerald Park residents are active residents, they like to walk!" says Planner/Development Officer Paige Phillips. "We heard concerns about safety for those walking along Great Plains Road. Through our relationship with the Ministry of Highways, we were able to secure a commitment from them to work on a pathway design to fit next to the road." Jedlic added that a future phase will see a pathway connection between Great Plains Road and South Plains Road.

north of Highways 1 and 46 and a new washroom/storage facility at the Emerald Park soccer field is in the works. It was announced in October the WCRM158 Waste Water Authority's wastewater treatment project (a cooperative project between the RM/White City) has received approval in principle from both the federal and provincial governments through the Building Canada Fund.

The information gathered - to date - reveals over 1,637 employees work at RM businesses. For business owners, the RM offers to promote the businesses on their website and hopes to offer business-focused networking opportunities and co-branded print promotion in the future. For the RM, the returned applications result in valuable statistics. "It helps ensure our record keeping is up-to-date, including employment numbers," Phillips said. "These statistics clearly reveal the RM's growth and help us plan future infrastructure. We continue to research and have conversations about public transportation options. With the information provided by RM businesses, we have real numbers to work with when dealing with provincial and federal agencies." Printed business license


