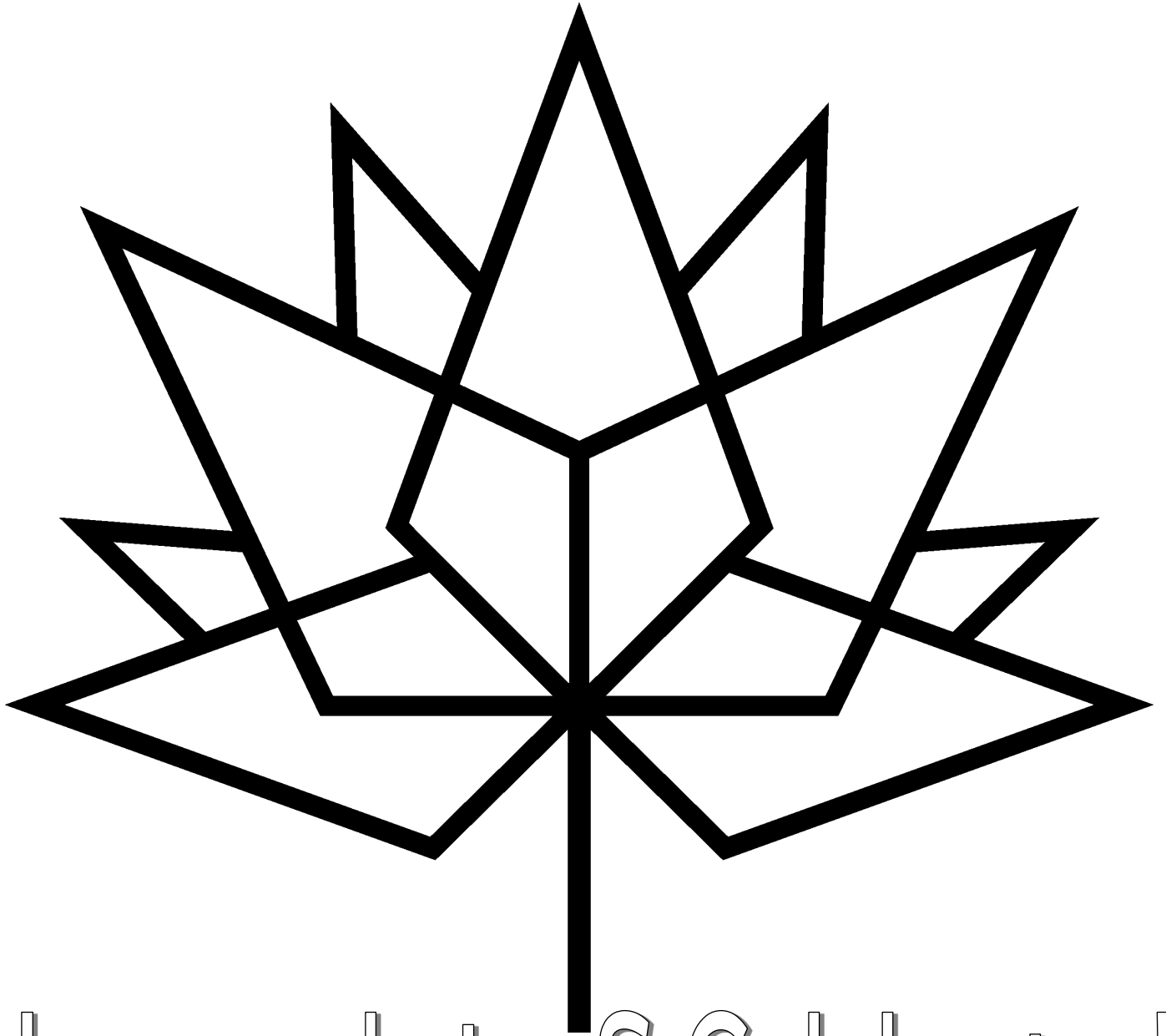

A few DO's and DON'TS from the Town

As this is the last edition of the News and Views before the summer hiatus, the Town would like to bring a few items to the attention of residents.

1. **Dogs and Cats**

DO Please keep your dogs and cats in your own yard. There is a Bylaw which prevents pets from wandering about the Town off-leash.

DON'T let them run loose to terrorize small children and defecate on public and private property.



2. **ATV and Dirt Bikes**



DON'T be driving your dirt bike up the Butte. Bikes and ATVs are to be operated only from your residence to the nearest point of entry or egress. There are guidelines as to the speed of the vehicles in town (10 kph) and who may ride them.

DO abide by the laws or risk having your vehicle impounded.



SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST** be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused (at the discretion of the Director of Public Works & Maintenance Operations) if this condition is not met. A maintenance man is on call after hours for emergencies and is available by calling **306-781-4547 Option 4**. Thank you.

3. **Fire Pits**

DON'T - It is unlawful to have open fires in the Town.

DO - Outdoor fires are allowed in a CSA approved commercial device.



4. **Fireworks**

Also illegal in the Town. DON'T be shooting them off in your back yard. The hot residual cylinders which fly about are a hazard to your neighbours and their property.

5. **Noise**

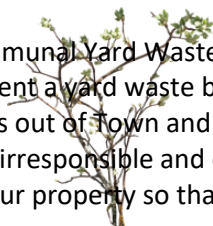
The Noise Bylaw is a 24-hour Bylaw.

DO be considerate of your neighbours at all hours and keep your dogs, parties, vehicles and music at a noise level that will not disturb the peace of a quiet summer day or night.

6. **Branches and Yard Waste**

It's true that Town no longer supplies a communal Yard Waste bin and that your only other options are to take compost to the Regina City dump or to rent a yard waste bin from Loraas.

But please, please DON'T just haul your mess out of town and dump it by the railroad tracks or on the side of a pretty little back road. How ridiculously irresponsible and childish is that? YOU are the property owner - it is up to YOU to conscientiously manage your property so that there is no impact on any property not your own.



7. **Nuisance Properties**

DO step back and look at your property as though you were seeing it for the first time. Is debris (polite word for junk) piled at the side of your garage, are unlicensed vehicles cluttering the driveway, are long grass and weeds accumulating everywhere? If a stranger were to look at your home is he going to say, "What messy person lives here?" Or might he say, "Wow, that is a beautifully kept yard."

You don't need to spend a fortune on flowers or lawn ornaments. If you keep your hedge trimmed, your fence painted, your grass mowed, your weeds pulled and your "debris" removed your whole neighbourhood is going to look better. If a few flowers happen to fall into your yard, so much the better.



8. **Safety Audit results**

DO ensure that the number of your home is clearly marked on the outside for ease of response by emergency vehicles and in case of any need to identify location.

9. **Summertime!**

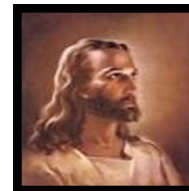
DO take time this summer to enjoy some of the walking paths in the Town. Come out on a warm summer day, sit in the bleachers and catch a ball game while your kids play in the playground. Climb the hill under a full moon and watch it track a silver path across the Discovery Ridge Lake.

Do engage your neighbours, visit over the back fence, watch the kids play. We hear all the time that people move to Pilot Butte for the small town atmosphere. That's you; YOU make the small town atmosphere, so slow down, go for ice cream, kick back and relax in another Pilot Butte summer.

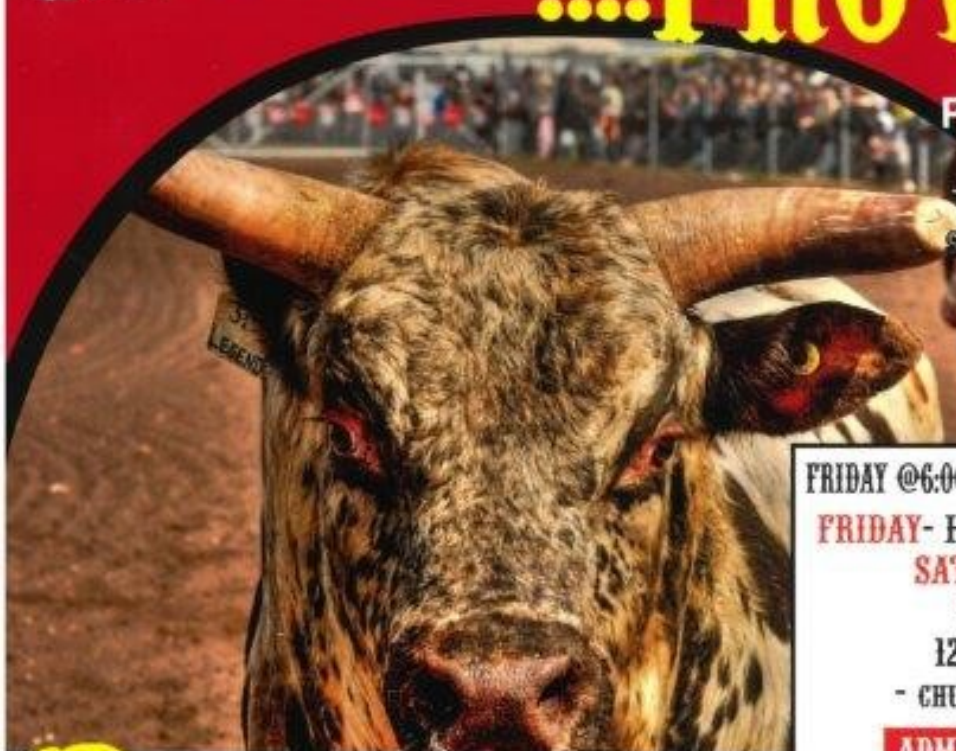

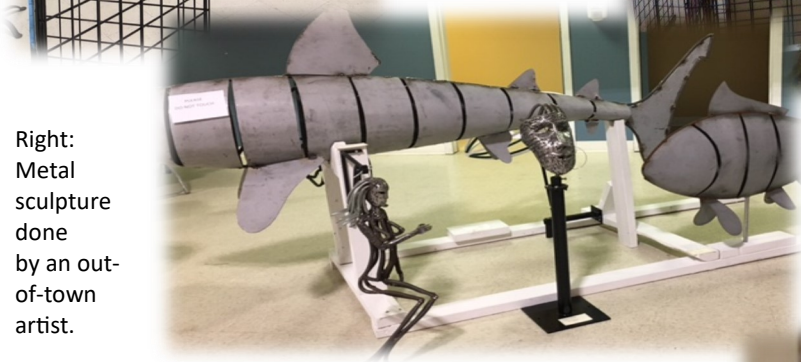

But at preschool this May we've had a "Dino-Mite" time spending the month focused on learning about dinosaurs--a popular interest of children at this age! It's hard to imagine that these giant and magnificent creatures once roamed the land around us. The preschoolers explored various aspects of a dinosaur's life. How were they born and how did they die? What did they eat? How do we know they existed and just how big can dinosaurs get? A message from the RM of Edenwold

Fire agreements signed

At the May 9 council meeting, fire protection and emergency services agreements were signed with our urban neighbours the Town of Balgonie, Town of Pilot Butte, Town of White City and Village of Edenwold. "By signing these agreements we were able to move past the interim agreements and finalize things for 2017," says Chief Administrative Officer Kim McIvor. "We have been working hard as a group to come up with a fair and equitable way to share the costs of providing fire and emergency services to all residents and business communities within the White Butte region." The Town of White City will receive: \$88,433, the Town's Balgonie and Pilot Butte have both been allocated \$55,000 and \$15,000 will be paid to the Village of Edenwold for 2017. The signed agreements represent many months of discussions and negotiations with the White Butte Fire Commission members and the fire chiefs. A long-term agreement is still in the works. "We are very pleased to work with and support the committed volunteers of the local fire departments and their members who are willing to help their communities in the times they need them the most," says McIvor.

Community engages in Official Community Plan

RM Planners Jana Jedic and Paige Phillips gave council an overview of the findings from early community engagement meetings and the survey tool used to update the RM's Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw. "We heard a lot of different feedback, depending on the area of the RM the residents were from," says Jedic. The key emerging themes are: ensure compatible land uses, protect and maintain the character of residential subdivisions in Emerald Park and acreage developments, encourage and support the development of more recreational amenities, protect prime agricultural lands, improve signage for roadways and business districts and address drainage issues in some areas. "We are going to go back to the business community with a newly developed survey," explains Jedic. "We want a deeper response base from that sector of the RM." Over 200 residents engaged in the survey process through attendance at meetings and filling out the survey.

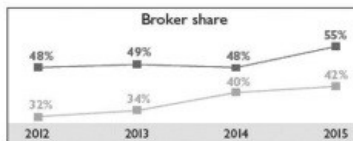

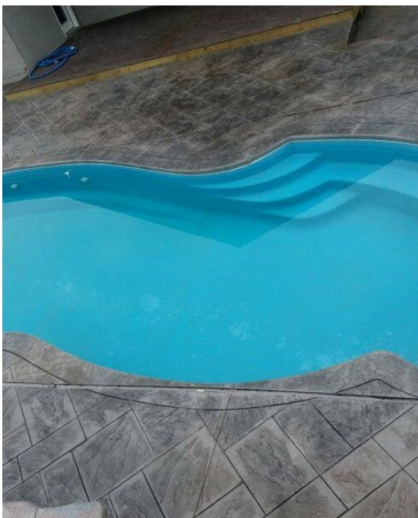
