SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked** by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused (at the discretion of the Director of Public Works & Maintenance Operations) if this condition is not met. A maintenance man is on call after

hours for emergencies and is available by calling 306-781-4547 Option 4. Thank you.

BOULEVARD PARKING

However much we might like to avoid it, winter is here. That means snow removal. And **THAT** means that, for the winter season, residents must remove trailers and any other items stored or otherwise parked on the boulevards. Vehicles that are being used every day may be parked on the boulevards for periods no longer than 72 hours starting at the end

October. The 72- hour restriction does not mean that you drive your vehicle around the block and re-park it every 72 hours. It means that any vehicle not in regular use should not be parked on the boulevard for the winter months. The boulevards are provided to you for your convenience but they are Town property and, for ease of snow removal, the Town requires them to be unobstructed for the winter. Properties in Violation will be ticketed by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer. Please remember that there is NEVER parking allowed on the travelled portion of the road where no curb exists.

The Town thanks you in advance for your cooperation and appreciates your commitment to making Pilot Butte the BEST town in which to live.

Snow go, go, go...

RM maintenance staff clear roads of snow in order of the following priority: ensuring school routes/ emergency routes are clear, then secondary arteries and finally internal roads within estates and subdivisions. If you see an issue that you think RM staff should be made aware of, please contact the office at: 306-771-2522

Weed control

The RM of Edenwold maintenance team is committed to fighting noxious weeds within the RM. Leafy spurge, wild parsnip and common burdock (which looks like rhubarb but grows tall) can inhibit surface drainage and choke out native plants and vegetation. A tip to homeowners: wild bird seed and packages of wild flower seed can contain seed for these weeds. For more information about noxious weeds within the RM, and opportunities for landowners to protect their property, contact the RM office at 306-771-2522

DID YOU KNOW?...

The RM of Edenwold hires summer students each summer through the WUQWATER program. Those students in turn map areas of the RM that have an identified noxious weed issue and when those areas were treated.


The highlight of our month was our annual Dessert pom-pom nos Night and Christmas concert. We rented the Pilot Butte from the top!


