SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused** (at the discretion of the Director of Public Works & Maintenance Operations) if this condition is not met. A **maintenance man is on call after**

hours for emergencies and is available by calling 306-781-4547 Option 4. Thank you.



As of May 1st the 72 hour parking restriction on boulevards Yay, we survived another winter. Now that sunny skies and warmer temperatures are here the Town wishes to remind residents of summer parking restrictions.no longer applies. This relaxation of the restriction applies **only** to boulevards.

- ⇒ Street parking for periods over 72 hours is never allowed. As in the winter this 72 hour restriction does not mean that you drive your vehicle around the block and re-park it every 72 hours. It means that any vehicle not in regular use **should not be parked** on the street. The streets are not to be used for storage of vehicles.
- ⇒ Please remember that there is **NEVER** parking allowed on the pavement where no curb exists.
- ⇒ While recreation vehicles (campers) and trailers are not restricted from parking on the boulevards or curbed streets, please exercise discretion in parking on those sites. Streets and boulevards were not designed to accept the haphazard parking of campers or trailers. Being larger than cars they restrict sight lines and create blind spots for drivers in respect of small children and other vehicles. Small trailers full of debris are considered unsightly and are not acceptable
- ⇒ No unregistered vehicle may be parked on public lands or in private front yards.

Vehicles in Violation will be ticketed by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer and may be towed if not moved within a week after the ticket is issued.

Please remember that streets are shared with everyone else in Town; consider your neighbours when you use public roadways for private parking.

The Town thanks you for your cooperation and appreciates your commitment to making Pilot Butte the community of choice.



Our Furry Friends and their "deposits" . . .

This came to the attention of the News and viewS in regards to our Furry Friends! It is a timely article on how our responsibilities as citizens are so far reaching and never ending! Please read and help our community stay as beautiful as possible!



Wherever we live, we have every right to choose to share our home with a furry friend. Animals enrich our lives, give us comfort, keep us company, make us laugh. The choice, though, comes with responsibilities. We must

respect the rights of others who do not wish to share their home, property or common areas with a dog or cat.

Now that summer is almost here, many of you may be spending more time outside with your pets. You might want to check out the bylaws on the town website in regards to dogs and cats and licencing your pet. Be reminded that it is not acceptable at any time for anyone to allow pet droppings to remain where they are deposited. Pets are so cute when they are babies but they do grow up!

There are as many non-pet-owning residents, as there are pet-owning residents. It is expected that responsible owners, when walking their dogs, carry on their person those materials which will facilitate the collection of droppings that may occur when walking pets. This is particularly important when you enjoy a walk down the pathways and public areas that are <u>shared</u> with all of the other residents of the Town who do not deserve to be presented with reminders of a pet's passage.

Inland Park contains stations with polite little bags for residents

who have come away from home unprepared, along with several garbage containers for disposal. As for cats, there are few things more unpleasant than to be happily digging in a flower-bed and to thrust a hand into droppings from the neighbour's cats. It is appreciated that cats may be keeping down the rodent population but please keep cats at home.

Finally, we all know that it is **NOT** Ok to just open our door and let our pet out to run free and to defecate where it pleases. It is **NOT** OK to walk our dogs off-leash (Town bylaw) and allow them to defecate in the yards of other residents or on ball diamonds or soccer fields or streets while you stand on the street or walkway and pretend you don't see him. Again, there are lots of people in town who have made the choice not to keep a pet; they shouldn't have to clean their yards because of someone else's pet. Those of us who have children and grandkids — we want them to play in our yard and not have to worry about cleaning pet droppings in our fenced back yard before we can go out to enjoy the sunshine!

If it is already your practice to clean up after your pet, as it is for most of you, many thanks and you are applauded for your commitment to keeping our town beautiful.

There are many areas in our town where walking dogs is a very pleasant exercise. Enjoy the summer out with your pet.



April!

What has no eyes, ears, lungs, arms or legs, eats its weight in food every day, breaths through

its skin and can live up to 10 years? It's our friend the earthworm! At preschool this month the children explored the life of an earthworm and the importance of caring for living beings. Gently with our hands we held and observed how the wiggly creatures felt and moved. To see the worm tunnels we made a worm "hotel" out of a clear plastic jar filled with alternating layers of soil and sand. We checked our worms daily and fed our worms dried leaves and old vegetable scraps and carefully spritzed them with a water bottle so they wouldn't dry out! But if a worm has no eyes would it notice the light? The children discovered worms still sense light despite having no eyes! They wiggled away whenever we shone a flashlight on them.

Our gardener's friend the earthworm was also a great springboard to practice digging for and counting rubber worms in a giant bucket of topsoil. Our puppet friend "Super Worm" taught us about the letters "W and S" which, by the way, look a lot like worms! We painted "worm tracks" with cooked spaghetti dipped in paint and used string "worms" to measure objects around the classroom. We also made clay sculptures of worms, worm cocoons and even "castings" (uh hum...that's worm poop). These were but a few of the many wormy activi-

ties that elicited several "Ewwws!" from the preschoolers (and their teacher). J

We are now getting ready to investigate the topic "Farms!" and are looking forward to a trip to 49 Rivers Ranch north of Regina to see real farm animals up close.

Hard to Believe Worm

Facts: Did You Know?

- Baby worms are not born. They hatch from cocoons smaller than a grain of rice.
- The largest earthworm ever found was in South Africa and measured 22 feet from its nose to the tip of its tail.
- In one acre of land, there can be more than a million earthworms.
- Worms are tough little creatures. If you accidentally cut an earthworm in half while gardening, only half will die. The piece with the saddle (the fatter, pink part) will survive.
- Even though worms do not have eyes, they can sense light, especially at their anterior (front end). They move away from light and will become paralyzed if exposed to light for too long.




A message from the RM of Edenwold

RM responds to survey sent out to RM residents

We are aware that a survey has been distributed by the town of White City to gather information from the community. This survey was delivered door-to-door to residents of not only the town, but also Emerald Park, and the surrounding residential subdivisions of Escott/Deneve, Park Meadows, and Meadow Ridge, all of which are within the jurisdiction of the RM of Edenwold. In spring 2017, the RM of Edenwold's Planning Department held five public meetings and distributed a comprehensive survey to get input from both residents and business operators. A follow-up survey was then hand-delivered to businesses in the summer of 2017. Your input -qathered in 2017 - is invaluable and will help inform policy and our new Official

- Division 3: Expanding boundary South to include all of Aspen Village and the north side of South Plains Road.
- Division 4: Southern boundary moving North to Highway #1 & Northern boundary moving South to Township Road 182.
- Division 6: Southern boundary moving South to Township Road 182.

After public consultation and council discussion, divisional boundaries for divisions 2, 3, 4 and 6 have been altered. The last of three public meetings on the topic boundary realignment was held March 21 in Emerald Park with twelve residents attending.

"This year, elections for even numbered divisions will be held in October," says Kim McIvor, Chief Administrative Officer with the RM of Edenwold. "With changing demographics within the RM, the boundary realignment addressses changing population densities and the RM's geographical diversity."

"This change completes a two phase solution approach, which began in 2016 with the redrawing of divisional boundaries to create a fully changed Division 3," explains Reeve Mitchell Huber. "With phase two now completed, we thank our residents for participating in public meetings and engaging in discussions with staff and council members. The work done here shows we're listening as a council and that our community is engaged." Maps showing the revised boundaries can be found on the RM website. Nomination day is September 19 - the day candidates must announce they are running in municipal elections.
