Summer Parking

As of May 1st the 72 hour parking restriction on boulevards Yay, we survived another winter. Now that sunny skies and warmer temperatures are here the Town wishes to remind residents of summer parking restrictions.no longer applies. This relaxation of the restriction applies **only** to boulevards.

- ⇒ Street parking for periods over 72 hours is never allowed. As in the winter this 72 hour restriction does not mean that you drive your vehicle around the block and re-park it every 72 hours. It means that any vehicle not in regular use **should not be parked** on the street. The streets are not to be used for storage of vehicles.
- ⇒ Please remember that there is **NEVER** parking allowed on the pavement where no curb exists.
- ⇒ While recreation vehicles (campers) and trailers are not restricted from parking on the boulevards or curbed streets, please exercise discretion in parking on those sites. Streets and boulevards were not designed to accept the haphazard parking of campers or trailers. Being larger than cars they restrict sight lines and create blind spots for drivers in respect of small children and other vehicles. Small trailers full of debris are considered unsightly and are not acceptable.
- ⇒ No unregistered vehicle may be parked on public lands or in private front yards.

Vehicles in Violation will be ticketed by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer and may be towed if not moved within a week after the ticket is issued.

Please remember that streets are shared with everyone else in Town; consider your neighbours when you use public roadways for private parking.

The Town thanks you for your cooperation and appreciates your commitment to making Pilot Butte the community of choice.



SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused** (at the discretion of the Director of Public Works & Maintenance Operations) if this condition is not met. A **maintenance man is on call after**

hours for emergencies and is available by calling 306-781-4547 Option 4. Thank you.

A message from the RM of Edenwold

About the annexation proposal The RM of Edenwold was informed May 15 that White City has put forward a proposal for the annexation of Emerald Park and other parcels of lands and estates including Park Meadows, Escott/Deneve,

Meadow Ridge, Great Plains Industrial Park and Prairie View Business Park.

RM staff and council will take time to review the proposal.

In the meantime, we have posted some information on our website about annexation and water/sewer and tax comparisons. A public engagement meeting is being hosted by the town June 6. Big loads, new roads. RM meets with business owners and operators...

Several businesses within the RM of Edenwold involve the service and sale of large and oversize equipment. With the new Highway 1 overpasses in place, the RM set up a meeting with the businesses involved in heavy or oversized hauling to talk about how roadways are being used. The meeting brought 20 business owners together with council members to talk and ask questions.

The object of the meeting was to gather feedback on the functionality of the road network and dete priorities for tweaks and changes to make everything work better for heavy truck traffic. Among several concerns, the RM heard that, even with the overpasses in place at Pilot Butte and

Balgonie, businesses are using the Highway 48 overpass and the RM of Edenwold roads from Highway 33 through to Viterra Road (aka Highway 624, Richardson Rd.) to South Plains Road and Great Plains Road to access businesses.

The RM will recommend that MOH and RBDB engage in a public awareness campaign to detail how the sses fit equipment and to let the driving public know how they can interact on those overpasses with oversized trucks and equipment.

Over the last twenty years those grants represent hundreds of thousands

or dollars. The RIM of Edenwold also pays library taxes to keep the local libraries (Southeast Regional Library branches) viable. In 2017, that amounted to \$40,000 for the White City, Balgonie and Pilot Eture libraries. And, as good neighbours, the RIM has also kicked in \$21,000 for the White City library renovation (2017), \$30,000 (2013) for the football field at Wh. City School and in 2012, donated \$1,500 for fencing and \$3,000 for a security camera at the White City Skate Park.


