The Town of Pilot Butte would like to remind residents of: "Bylaw No. 11-2017 - A Bylaw to License and Regulate Dogs Running at Large; Dog & Cat Control - Ownership and Possession"

Please note the town has made available for your use, stations with baggies for dog owners to clean up after their pets. Thank you!

Parking

While the weather is warming up, spring is not quite here yet. We ask residents to please refer to the following:

Bylaw No.13-2011 - A Bylaw to Regulate the Operation of Vehicles

Winter parking restriction still apply. In regard to parking on Town streets and boulevards, residents are asked to please note the following:

Parking on Boulevards is restricted to 72 hours until April 30. This means that only vehicles in regular use may be parked there. There is no provision for storing vehicles, trailers, boats or anything else on Town boulevards for the duration of the winter.

For the summer months, from May 1st until October 30th, there are no restrictions on boulevard parking except for the following:

- A) No large recreation vehicles may block sight lines, causing visibility issues for drivers or bicycles.
- B) No unlicensed or junked vehicles may be parked on Town boulevards (or anywhere outside of a fence or garage)

Parking on the paved, travelled part of streets without curbs is never allowed.

Parking on streets with curbs is allowed, but again, the Town appreciates that you will not use street parking for storage of boats, trailers or campers. Thank you for your cooperation.



SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused (at the discretion of the Town Maintenance Director) if this condition is not met. A maintenance man is on call after hours for

emergencies and is available by calling 306-781-4547 Option 7. Thank you.

son to chain himself to his existence.

And yet, somehow, Ove finds himself driving

his pregnant neighbour to the hospital; taking in and reconciling a gay young man with his homophobic father; thwarting the authorities to enable an old friend to stay in his own home; and becoming an adopted grandfather. Ove disguises these acts of kindness behind a gruff exterior and a shaky framework of self-serving excuses. In spite of his grouchy old-man persnickety ways you are not very far into the book before you are on to Ove and enjoy watching him rationalize reasons to extend his large, work-worn, helping hand to those who need it.

Backman treats his protagonist with sympathetic understanding and humour. On more than one page tears blend into laughter as Ove's attempts to join his wife

are thwarted yet again by circumstance (and an observant and tactful neighbour.) I loved this book. It was a fast read and I made such friends with the characters that I was bereft when the book ended and their stories were closed to me. I wanted to remain part of their lives and find out what happens next. And next.

It's been such a cold winter but finally with the arrival of March we welcomed the many colours of a rainbow into our daily activities! The preschoolers spent time investigating the science behind how real rainbows are created and the effects of colour mixing. We also used many classic and award winning children's books such as "A Rainbow of My Own", and "Little Blue and Little Yellow" for example, as springboards to learning how to make coloured patterns, sequencing, gra-

phing and distinguishing between primary and secondary colours. There were many happy squeals during our "coloured water-droplet races with eyedroppers and straws! They loved blowing the droplets together on wax paper to create new secondary colours!

Exploring Rainbow Cloud Jars was one of the biggest hits with the children! They discovered the effects of colour mixing in addition to strengthening fine motor muscles. Perhaps it's something you might like to try at home! Fill a quart size jar 3/4 full of water. Squirt shaving cream on top. Next use eyedroppers to drop coloured water on the shaving cream and watch as the colours mix to create a spectacular "rainbow cloud". We even made a

real rainbow using a prism and flashlight on the ceiling of a darkened room...that certainly brought out the excited giggles!



Project update: community mail boxes

In November, Council approved two community mailbox pilot projects for

the Carson Business Park and Spruce Creek Estates. RM staff has been working with Canada Post on the preparations for



the Carson Business Park first, which we expect will be rolled out in spring or early summer, with Spruce Creek Estates to follow. There is a possibility of including other businesses in the Butte Business District as well. We'll keep you posted.

Grading 2019

RM maintenance teams are preparing for grading work to begin for 2019. "We are getting good drainage during spring run off so far this year," says Derek Hradecki, Manager of Public Works Rural with the RM. A reminder to the traveling public sharing space on roads with RM graders: please be patient with grader

operators and please slow down to 40 km/hr when passing. We want everyone to get home safe at the end of their day.

Spring road restrictions

Council has opted out of spring road restrictions issued by the province's Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure. Haulers still need to check orders issued each Tuesday and Friday. There is now an alert bar at the top of the RM website at RMEdenwold.ca. By opting out, council is allowing hauls of secondary highway weights (as opposed to restricted weights) on municipal roads within the RM. Your overweight permit is not valid during this period.

Lagoon decommissioning and wastewater treatment facility update

The lagoons that served the community for more than 20 years are being decommissioned in preparation for the start up of the wastewater treatment facility. The lagoons sit off of

Hutchence Road in Emerald Park. The southwestern lagoons will be decommissioned first followed by the northeastern lagoons. The RM recently awarded the project contract to KMS Construction and construction is underway. The facility is a cooperative project with the town of White City, the provincial and federal governments. The facility will increase capacity for the community and is currently in the testing phase.

Making a list, checking it twice

Council approved a new Construction Procedures Checklist to assist developers and contractors. The list ensures they are meeting all requirements of roadway and infrastructure construction projects. The checklist is to help with overall project management processes and will be included any time a servicing agreement, development permit or contract is provided by the RM. It will also help staff and council stay apprised of a

project's status. A Yard Maintenance Policy has been approved by council and posted on the RM website (see the Administration page). This policy came about in response to residents' concerns about maintenance of properties within the RM. All of this works toward the betterment of being a good neighbour.
