

#### WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Yes, that season of snow removal is coming. While we have had a lovely long summer to enjoy our boulevard parking, residents are reminded that, from November 1 to April 30, there is a 72 hour restriction on parking on Town boulevards.

- \*\* The boulevard is the Town-owned land between the edge of the paved street and your property line.
- \*\* On streets with no curb, there is NO allowance for parking on the pavement at any time.
- \*\* On streets with no curb, the boulevard may be used for parking of vehicles in daily use. The 72 hour restriction doesn't mean that you drive your vehicle around the block and re-park it. It means that you cannot store vehicles on the boulevard during the winter months. The same thing applies to paved streets where there is a curb.
- \*\* On any street, whether there is or is not a curb, the Town appreciates that vehicles will not be parked either on the boulevard or on the pavement when snowfall is imminent. When operators are cleaning the streets, particularly after heavy snowfall, that snow has to go somewhere. The boulevards serve that purpose.

The Town thanks all those residents who help us out by complying with the law. Please be asssured that vehicles which are left on boulevards or on streets may be ticketed and /or towed.





**SEWAGE BLOCKAGE** - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused** (at the discretion of the Town Maintenance Director) if this condition is not met. A **maintenance man is on call after hours for** 

emergencies and is available by calling 306-781-4547 Option 6. Thank you.

Please do not ride across these fields and cause damage to the crops. There is always


a detour available. Respecting their land will keep us all in good standing with the farm community around us.



Priorities for the year ahead include:

- re-examining divisional boundaries to give more opportunity to citizens of Emerald Park to participate in Council
- moving forward with infrastructure and roadworks projects such as water and sewer extensions to business districts and drainage projects in rural and country residential areas
- continuing to work with our neighbours in the Village of Edenwold towards a joint Municipal District governance structure
- seeing resolution to the White City annexation plan

#### Reminders

Christmas trees: Tree collection service for Emerald Park residents will be available during the week of January 13th. Please lay your tree down at the end of your property before the 13th for pickup.

Snow removal: Main roads and high-traffic routes are prioritized for snow clearing in all areas followed by local roads. Please slow down when passing or approaching snow-clearing machinery. When clearing private driveways and walkways, do not place snow on roads, in ditches or on neighbouring properties.

Snow storage: The municipality has identified snow storage sites for local businesses to clear their parking lots. Please visit the RM office for more information.

#### Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw

Thank you to everyone who has participated in the process of developing new plans and regulations for the municipality. Numerous residents and businesses have contributed as well as other stakeholders such as members of crown corporations, government ministries, utility and transportation companies, and citizens, staff and Councils of neighbouring communities.

The last stage of this process involves consideration of some final alterations to the bylaws based on feedback received from the public and stakeholders. A public hearing will be held on January 14th, 2020 at 7:00pm in Council Chambers to obtain comments on the alterations to the bylaws. Council will then be in a position to consider the bylaws as a whole and move forward with final approval and submission to the Ministry of Government Relations for Ministerial Approval and adoption.
