Voting is easy!

- 1. Bring your Voter's Registration
 Form with you (or fill out at the
 poll—bring a pen) and sign the form in
 front of the Deputy Returning Officer.
- Show your ID (such as a Driver's Licence or show 2 pieces of ID, both with your name and at least 1 showing your current address) and you will be handed two ballots—a Mayoral ballot and a Councillor Ballot.
- 3. Go behind the voting screen. Mark an X next to the Mayor Candidate of your choice and mark an X for up to 6 Councillor Candidates of your choice.
- 4. Re-fold your ballots. Keep your choice a secret.

5. An election worker will show you the appropriate ballot boxes to drop your ballots in.

That's it. You have voted!

Watch for an election flyer in the mail along with (1) Voter's Registration Form to copy and fill out if more than one voter in the household (also on the website).

Beautification Update - Christmas Fundraiser





Trick or Treating & Haunted Houses

The Town of Pilot Butte would like to provide residents with guidelines to a safe Halloween. All of the guideline information is from the Reopen Saskatchewan Plan dated September 25th/2020.



Neighbourhood Trick or Treating

- * Physical Distancing of 6 feet should be maintained with those outside your extended house-hold
- * Candy should be handed out using tools such as tongs to help eliminate accidental contact
- * If a house is busy, you can either wait while maintaining physical distancing or come back when it is less busy
- Due to the number of people potentially touching the treats prior to being handed out,
 treats should be disinfected or held for 72 hours before eating
- * It is recommended that only store bought treats be handed out
- * Limit the number of people handing out treats as much as possible
- * Trick or Treats should carry hand sanitizer with them and individuals handing out treats should also use hand sanitizer or wash their hands frequently
- * The Government of Saskatchewan Reopen Plan suggests incorporating non-medical masks into costumes

The Town of Pilot Butte will be providing Orange Flags to indicate houses handing out treats this year. If a house has an orange flag on their lawn know that they are handing out treats. Please respect homes without flags or lights off. Locations to pick up flags will be determined soon and will be available starting October 28th.

Haunted Houses

- * Haunted houses must have a one-way traffic flow to promote physical distancing
- Use markings/dividers/visual cues in common areas to ensure physical distancing between groups
- Non-medical masks are an additional measure that participants can use when physical distancing might be unpredictable
- * Hand Hygiene stations should be available to participants before, during and after visiting (Hand Sanitizer should be Health Canada approved)



Walk-through times between groups must be a minimum of 10 minutes apart to avoid congestion in the haunted house

...that your new home may include the header or posts for a deck. This does not indicate that a deck was included with your home build. Your builder is aware whether your deck was included with the build of your home.

If your deck is not included with the permit for your new home, a Deck Permit must be submitted and approved prior to construction.

A Note About Waste Collection

There are occasions when the collections for garbage, recycling and compost are delayed and carts are not emptied at the usual times of day. A change of driver, or route; a mechanical failure, any number of things may delay the service. Loraas advises that *THERE WILL ALWAYS BE SERVICE*. Unless inclement weather makes travelling unsafe, the truck will always come eventually. It may be later that evening, it may be the next morning, but the carts will be emptied. You are always welcome to contact the Town office if your cart has not been collected by the morning of the next day. Occasionally the odd cart or street is missed, but it is not abnormal for the whole town to receive service much later than the usual time. If is very windy, you may want to bring your cart in for the night and replace it the next morning.

Remember, too, that Loraas provides service on Mondays and Thursdays regardless of holidays.



SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused** (at the discretion of the Town Maintenance Director) if this condition is not met. A **maintenance man is on call after hours** *for*

emergencies and is available by calling 306-781-4547 Option 6. Thank you.

Winter Parking Restrictions

The Town reminds residents that Town boulevards are provided to residents for the parking of vehicles which are in daily use and that boulevards are never intended for storage of campers, automobiles, trailers or any other items owned by residents.

As winter approaches, the Town expects that all vehicles, etc. except those in daily use will be removed from boulevards for the facilitation of operations of the Town (e.g. snow removal). The Town *Operation of Vehicles Bylaw 13-2011* allows for vehicles to be parked on boulevards for periods not exceeding 72 hours during the winter months. *AT NO TIME* may vehicles be parked for periods *longer than 72 hours* on the pavement of any curbed street and may never be parked on the pavement of a street with no curb.

During times of imminent snowfall, the Town hopes that residents will be mindful of the safety of the Town workers and their own property by removing vehicles from both street and boulevard, curbed or otherwise.

When snowfall is heavy, there are going to be times when it is not possible for the grader to clean streets without leaving some ridge of snow across the ends of driveways. The priority is to have the streets cleared and passable. If time and manpower allow, the Town may clear significant ridges once streets are all cleared. It is not reasonable to expect that whole frontages will remain cleared of a snow ridge.

That snow that you don't want in your driveway has to go somewhere and part of the purpose of Townowned boulevards is to provide that option. Part of the privilege of using the boulevard is for you to keep it clear for your own use.

The Town thanks all residents who comply with parking restrictions and keep our maintenance workers safe.
