Bylaw 03-2021 A BYLAW RESPECTING THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE.

ATV Registration to begin mid April and the following rules will apply:

- All ATV's operating within Town Limits must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
   Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum speed of 30km/hr.
- The Town recommends that residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from their place of residence.
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are NOT permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.

If your deck is not included with the permit for your new home, a Deck Permit must be submitted and approved prior to construction.

#### YARD MAINTENANCE POLICY

#### Purpose of policy:

The Town of Pilot Butte's Yard Maintenance Policy was created so that residents can enjoy a safe and attractive community while also creating a predictable enforcement process. The Town of Pilot Butte recognizes the importance of the appearance and amenity of the entire Town and has implemented this policy to encourage landowners to keep their lots tidy throughout the summer months. This policy will adhere to the Town of Pilot Butte Bylaw No. 14-2005.

#### Scope of policy:

This policy is effective throughout the entire Town on residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and vacant lots.

#### Inspections:

- Grass and weeds will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- Untidy and Unsightly properties will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- If, upon inspection, the Bylaw Enforcement or delegate determines a lot requires maintenance, the Town will arrange to have the lot maintained after following the notification process stated in *Section 4: Notification*.
- Inspections of residential subdivisions will occur on the dates stated in *Schedule A: Inspection Dates*, which are subject to change annually.
- Inspections of other untidy and unsightly yards causing a nuisance will occur as complaints are received.
- Inspections will be done on the following dates: June 15, July 20, August 17 and September 30.

# VOLUNTEER GROUP SPOTLIGHT FOLLOW UP - JUNE 2021 White Butte Broncos Baseball

1. Can you provide us an update on your current projects? How are they doing?

Broncos Baseball began as the Pilot Butte Minor Ball Association, circa 1996. The 100 or so players at inception grew to the 300+ we have today. At first, all AAA baseball players had to play on teams in Regina, but we have been adding AAA divisions as our registration numbers have grown. This season, we offer 18U AAA for the first time. Around 2004, softball joined the association, which was later renamed the White Butte Minor Ball Association to acknowledge the larger community we serve. Broncos Baseball and Storm Softball are two branches of this association, but retain financial independence.

Any kids in Pilot Butte who want to play ball register with White Butte Minor Ball. Typically, girls register for softball and boys register for baseball. Half of our 11U baseball games are played in Pilot Butte as there's also an 11U diamond in White City. Most of our 13U games are played in Pilot Butte, often under the

2. Do you have any projects coming up in the near future you would like the community to know about?

The project we are working on now is the renovation of diamond 4 in Balgonie. 18U A and AA uses diamond 2 there. However, it is undersized by BaseballSask standards and unsuitable for AAA because of their skill and power. Because of space constraints, it makes the most sense to expand diamond 4 (a softball diamond) and then convert diamond 2 over to softball. We are currently fundraising for that project.

The 2021 Communities in Bloom (CiB) Yard competition is on! This year we have partnered with Miracle-Gro in their 2021 Miracle-Gro "Best Garden Selection" program from Scott's Canada. The program consists of Scott's Canada providing communities from across Canada 6 signs each as well as Miracle-Gro gift packages and a congratulatory letter to showcase the "Best Garden Selection" of the community. The sign features the Miracle-Gro and CiB logo. In exchange for the Miracle-Gro gift packages the top 6 recipients must agree to supply us with a picture of their garden and sign and we will send them to the CiB National Office. These pictures will then be posted on the CiB website and Facebook page as well as Scott's Miracle-Gro Facebook page. CiB will also use the photos on their website and presentations at the awards ceremonies. Please note that we will be obtaining the signed release form authorizing the appropriate rights and permission to use the photos.

If you'd like to enter your yard for evaluation please do so by June 18th with the judging to be completed June 26th (weather dependent) with June 27th being the alternate date. Our evaluation criteria is as follows:

**Overall Impression**: tidiness and condition of property and garden, first impression – WOW factor!

**Floral Display**: design concept (arrangement, diversity, color), plant selection (native, local, innovative, edible, pollinator friendly), diversity of flower display and plants (flowers beds, raised beds, planters, hanging baskets, annuals, perennials, grasses, natural flora)

**Maintenance**: weed control, watering program, lawn care, tree and shrub maintenance

**Promotion of Habitat**: bird baths, feeders and houses, native plant species to promote pollinators and support insect and wildlife conservation

**Environmental Harm Reduction**: rain barrels to collect for irrigation, creative planter containers, outdoor furniture, use of reclaimed materials (wood, etc.), use of mulch to suppress weeds and lower watering requirements

**Mother's Day fundraiser** – petunia hanging baskets – SOLD OUT! Thank you to all that have supported this and past fund-raising efforts.

Pilot Butte's year-round **metal recycling bin** continues to be well used by residents. Your support will aid us in funding current and future projects. The **Community Clean Up Event** is well under way. The yard waste and refuse bins will be at the town maintenance yard until May 27<sup>th</sup>. Please continue to clean up litter in our community as every effort is appreciated.

Our pilot project of community raised vegetable garden boxes has been extremely popular. Our gardeners have been assigned to their boxes and should be planting soon. Please know that the vegetables grown in these spaces are for those



gardeners that are attending to them. Please keep your pets away. The Way of Life Church has graciously allowed us to place some beds on their garden site and we thank them for their collaborative efforts. We have <u>one</u> garden box still available so please call Jenelle @ 306 520 2048. The Way of Life Church may have available beds so please email Barb at: garden@wayoflifechurch.ca

The Food Forest located in the MR1 area at the Plains Development has been installed. With the unseasonably warm weather, we would appreciate any assistance we can get to keep this area well-watered. Once the plants are established, they will not need additional watering but for the first year we would gladly accept any watering assistance you may be able to give. We will have a rain barrel located on site soon. Thank you to the town staff for watering this site, every drop counts.

Are you asking, "What the heck is a food forest?" It is a deliberately designed site specific and high yielding perennial plant system for supporting human needs. All plants in this space are either edible or medicinal. We currently have the following planted in this space: apple, plum, sea buckthorn, saskatoon, highbush cranberry, ostrich fern, chives, yarrow, borage, calendula, strawberries, kinnikkinnick, creeping thyme, roman chamomile, and Jerusalem artichokes with more plants to come. Harvesting by community members will be encouraged once the plants start producing. We will be mulching this area soon to help retain moisture and reduce the weeding. We are trying to source free wood chips for mulch so if you are having tree work done, we will gladly accept the chippings from this effort. Please call Jenelle @ 306 520 2048 or Denise @ 306 537 9462 if you can help with this request.

Lion's bulletin board perennial bed has been planted. Go check it out, it looks great! Thank you to the Lion's for partnering with us on this project. They have supplied the outer structure and we looked after the plantings.

Hanging baskets, recreation centre, cemetery plantings, flowers in the boulevard east of the Dosu Wok and our Community Sunflower Seed Planting Project – these items will be happening shortly.



Help us ensure our community has great looking flowerbeds and planters again this summer.



White City Garden Club has enough help this year to plant the two large flowerbeds (White City Drive & Emerald Park Road) and the 42 planters (in 19 locations) throughout our community.

We still are looking for volunteers to help spread mulch on the two main flower beds (this goes quickly with a few volunteers), approximately mid June and to sign up for weeding duty.

You can volunteer for a week, (or weeks) when you inspect one or both beds and remove any weeds. A schedule is set up with two volunteers assigned to each week of the summer where they are responsible for a quick (usually only 20 minutes or less) weeding of one or both beds. Volunteers can weed at any convenient time during their week.

#### Here is the situation!

We have too many volunteers for the planters and not enough for planting the beds. If a few people are willing and able to switch that would help us out. Planting is scheduled for Thurs May 27 morning & afternoon.

If weather doesn't cooperate, then May 28 & 29 are alternate dates to plant the two beds.

#### We need volunteers for:

- Planting the two large beds May 27th or 28th/29th
- Mulching the beds early June
- Sign up for a week or two of weeding one or both beds.

Keep a lookout for the Red Lily Beetle on your lilies. I can confirm numerous siting's this spring. The bad news is capturing them and destroying them is about the only line of defense.



### LOCAL PANDEMIC COMEDY "HELL IN A HANDBASKET" TO PREMIERE AT MOONLIGHT MOVIES DRIVE-IN ON JUNE 24, 2021

On Thursday, June 24th, Moonlight Movies Drive-In will present a Lee Chambers double-bill.

The Pineville Heist feature from the writer & director will screen alongside a new comedy short film made in Pilot Butte, for a free charity screening to support front-line healthcare workers. Chambers, now based-in Pilot Butte, took his award-winning screenplay for Hell in a Handbasket from the 2020 Newark International Film Festival to camera last December with Saskatoon actor Robert Bryn Mann playing the character of Dale. A second actor, Hoyt Richards, phoned in his performance as Dr. Forester from Los Angeles. Richards, who last appeared in a Lancôme perfume commercial with Julia Roberts, is known to be considered as 'the world's first male supermodel'.

The 5-minute comedy features Dale, a lonely research scientist in the Arctic struggling to maintain his solitary existence. With the world failing from a global pandemic, all hopes fall on Dale's shoulders as he represents the last stand for humanity.

"I made the film under lockdown conditions in a garage in Pilot Butte in the dead of winter," notes Chambers. "It was a fun creative experiment to avoid going stir crazy under Covid-19."

The film version has been released in over 30 countries.


