The Town of Pilot Butte adopted:

Bylaw 03-2021 A BYLAW RESPECTING THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE.

ATV Registration to begin mid April and the following rules will apply:

- All ATV's operating within Town Limits must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
 Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum speed of 30km/hr.
- The Town recommends that residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from their place of residence.
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are NOT permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.
 - Please contact the Town Office or refer to our website for the Bylaws enforced within the Town of Pilot Butte.





...that your new home may include the header or posts for a deck. This does not indicate that a deck was included with your home build. Your builder is aware whether your deck was included with the build of your home.

If your deck is not included with the permit for your new home, a Deck Permit must be submitted and approved prior to construction.

The Town of Pilot Butte is pleased to announce that we are now accepting payments with select credit cards through our OptionPay System. Payments for Town of Pilot Butte services, including utilities, taxes, accounts receivable payments, permits/licenses and others, may be paid online or through the Town Office. Payments using an online service take 3 business days to process, please allow plenty of time before the due date to avoid interest fees. SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused** (at the discretion of the Town Maintenance Director) if this condition is not met. Please call 306-781-4547 - Option 1 during regular office hours. A **maintenance man is on call after hours** *for emergencies* and is available by

calling 306-781-4547 Option 6. Thank you.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Yes, that season of snow removal is coming. While we have had a lovely long summer to enjoy our boulevard parking, residents are reminded that, from November 1 to April 30, there is a 72 hour restriction on parking on Town boulevards. ** The boulevard is the Town-owned land between the edge of the paved street and your property line. Please remember that there is NEVER parking allowed on the travelled portion of the road where no curb exists. ** On streets with no curb, the boulevard may be used for parking of vehicles in daily use. The 72 hour restriction doesn't mean that you drive your vehicle around the block and re-park it. It means that you cannot store vehicles on the boulevard during the winter months. Residents must remove trailers and any other items stored or otherwise parked on the boulevards. The same thing applies to paved streets where there is a curb. ** On any street, whether there is or is not a curb, the Town appreciates that vehicles will not be parked either on the boulevard or on the pavement when snowfall is imminent. When operators are cleaning the streets, particularly after heavy snowfall, that snow has to go somewhere. The boulevards serve that purpose. The Town thanks all those residents who help us out by complying with the law. Please be assured that vehicles which are left on boulevards or on streets may be ticketed and /or towed.

YARD MAINTENANCE POLICY

Purpose of policy:

The Town of Pilot Butte's Yard Maintenance Policy was created so that residents can enjoy a safe and attractive community while also creating a predictable enforcement process. The Town of Pilot Butte recognizes the importance of the appearance and amenity of the entire Town and has implemented this policy to encourage landowners to keep their lots tidy throughout the summer months. This policy will adhere to the Town of Pilot Butte Bylaw No. 14-2005.

Scope of policy:

This policy is effective throughout the entire Town on residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and vacant lots.

Inspections:

- Grass and weeds will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- Untidy and Unsightly properties will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- If, upon inspection, the Bylaw Enforcement or delegate determines a lot requires maintenance, the Town will arrange to have the lot maintained after following the notification process stated in *Section 4: Notification*
- Inspections of residential subdivisions will occur on the dates stated in *Schedule A: Inspection Dates*, which are subject to change annually.
- Inspections of other untidy and unsightly yards causing a nuisance will occur as complaints are received.
- Final Inspections will be done on September 30, 2021.

A Municipal District is a type of municipality (like Rural Municipality, Village, Town, or City) created when two or more municipalities choose to come together, pool their resources, and create an entirely new entity. "Unlike RM's or Villages/Towns/Cities solely considered rural or urban, a Municipal District is regarded as both! "By being considered both urban and rural in the province's eyes, Municipal District's benefits by having access to services and programs that would be otherwise restricted.

While mentioned in provincial law, there are currently no Municipal Districts in Saskatchewan – thus, the MD of Edenwold would be the first of its kind in the province! "It will create net efficiencies; it would not compromise the service provided to residents and businesses, creating more effective services flow."


