

### Pilot Butte Public **Library Branch** October 5, 12 & 19, 2021 6 to 8 pm

SaskCulture is sponsoring Culture Days Hubs around the province to support the continued success of Culture Days in Saskatchewan, which will be held September 24 to October 24, 2021. The Library applied for sponsorship to SaskCulture with their community partner, the Pilot Butte Arts and both were approved. The Library will be offering a ribbon skirt making class, at NO CHARGE. All materials (must have your own sewing machine) will be supplied for a person to make their own ribbon skirt in the comfort of their home.

The Library and the Board were moved by the story of the young girl who was shamed for wearing her ribbon skirt to a formal school function. Education and promotion are integral to showing people why a ribbon skirt or shirt have significance to Indigenous people. Many other cultures have traditional dress that has meaning to them.

Ribbon skirts are historical and traditional clothing that honour First Nations heritage. It is also a symbol of resilience, sacredness and survival and can be worn anytime as well as for formal occasions.














### The Council Connection

The Town of Pilot Butte adopted

Bylaw 03-2021 A BYLAW RESPECTING THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE.

ATV Registration to begin mid April and the following rules will apply:

- All ATV's operating within Town Limits must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
   Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum speed of 30km/hr.
- The Town recommends that residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from their place of residence.
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are NOT permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.

### YARD MAINTENANCE POLICY

### Purpose of policy:

The Town of Pilot Butte's Yard Maintenance Policy was created so that residents can enjoy a safe and attractive community while also creating a predictable enforcement process. The Town of Pilot Butte recognizes the importance of the appearance and amenity of the entire Town and has implemented this policy to encourage landowners to keep their lots tidy throughout the summer months. This policy will adhere to the Town of Pilot Butte Bylaw No. 14-2005.

### Scope of policy:

This policy is effective throughout the entire Town on residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and vacant lots.

### Inspections:

- Grass and weeds will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- Untidy and Unsightly properties will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- If, upon inspection, the Bylaw Enforcement or delegate determines a lot requires maintenance, the Town will arrange to have the lot maintained after following the notification process stated in *Section 4: Notification*.
- Inspections of residential subdivisions will occur on the dates stated in *Schedule A: Inspection Dates*, which are subject to change annually.
- Inspections of other untidy and unsightly yards causing a nuisance will occur as complaints are received.
- Inspections will be done on the following dates: June 15, July 20, August 17 and September 30.



## BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS-STUDENTS



Look all ways before you cross the street. Cars can come around corners really fast. They also drive very fast and you must be very sure it is safe, before crossing the street.

Keep away from Parked cars. People driving cars can't see people in between other cars. They expect people to be at corners.

Ride your bike safely ~ Obey signs and signals. I bet you can ride your bike safely. Do you remember all the proper signals to turn and stop? I am sure that you know what the big street signs and traffic lights mean too! Then with your helmet on, you are riding your bike safely.

You can also play safe in your yard with mom or dad.

Walk when you cross the street. Do you know why you should walk when you cross the street? It is easier for the drivers of the vehicles to see you. It is also safer

Play in a safe place away from the street. Streets are for cars. Parks are for playing

so that you don't fall down

Where there is no sidewalk, walk on the left, facing traffic. Of course, it is always best to use a sidewalk. Do you have streets with no sidewalks in your neighbourhood? Then always walk facing traffic and watching traffic. That way, if you see a vehicle coming and the driver does not seem to see you ... you can always move over. Don't take a chance, move safely over and give lots of room between you and the car.

Always wear your seat-belt in the car. I know that you know this rule! Make sure you are wearing your seat-belt properly and know that you are safe.

Under this bylaw, residents and businesses will receive one warning before being fined up to \$250 for each false alarm. The RM hopes that by putting in place this bylaw, first responders will be able to respond to emergency calls more efficiently while providing an essential service to the community.

As part of the 2021 budget, RM council approved a municipal mill rate of 4.74 mills for all properties and the following mill rate factors for the different property classes:






...one appreciated gift at a time... Angel volunteers receive warmth from their creations from the heart.

Mrs. M's Best Ever Play Dough Recipe!

The benefits of using play dough for young children are wonderful and the play possibilities are endless! Here's my favourite recipe!

### Ingredients:

- 2 cups plain flour (all purpose)
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup salt
- 2 tablespoons cream of tartar

Up to 1.5 cups boiling water (adding in increments until it feels just right)

food colouring (optional) Or 2 pkgs. Unsweetened Kool-Aid **Method:** 

Mix the flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil in a large mixing bowl

Add food colouring TO the boiling water then into the dry ingredients

Stir continuously until it becomes a sticky, combined dough

Allow it to cool down then take it out of the bowl and knead it vigorously for a couple of minutes until all of the stickiness has gone. \* This is the most important part of the process, so keep at it until it's the perfect consistency
