Winter Parking Restrictions

The Town reminds residents that Town boulevards are provided to residents for the parking of vehicles which are in daily use and that boulevards are never intended for storage of campers, automobiles, trailers, boats or any other items owned by residents.

As winter approaches, the Town expects that all vehicles, etc. except those in daily use will be removed from boulevards for the facilitation of operations of the Town (e.g. snow removal). The Town Operation of Vehicles Bylaw 13-2011 allows for vehicles to be parked on boulevards for periods not exceeding 72 hours during the winter months. AT NO TIME may vehicles be parked for periods LONGER THAN 72 HOURS on the pavement of any curbed street and may never be parked on the pavement of a street with no curb. During times of imminent snowfall, the Town hopes that residents will be mindful of the safety of the Town workers and their own property by removing vehicles from both street and boulevard, curbed or otherwise.

When snowfall is heavy, there are going to be times when it is not possible for the grader to clean the street without leaving some ridge of snow across the ends of driveways. The priority is to have the streets cleared and passable. If time and manpower allow, the Town may clear significant ridges once streets are all cleared. It is not reasonable to expect that whole frontages will remain cleared of a snow ridge. That snow that you don't want in your driveway has to go somewhere and part of the purpose of Town-owned boulevards is to provide that option. Part of the privilege of using the boulevards is for you to keep clear for your own use.

The Town thanks all residents who comply with parking restrictions and keep our maintenance workers safe.

The Town of Pilot Butte adopted:

Bylaw 03-2021 A BYLAW RESPECTING THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE.

ATV Registration to begin mid April and the following rules will apply:

- All ATV's operating within Town Limits must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
 Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum speed of 30km/hr.
- The Town recommends that residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from their place of residence.
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are NOT permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.

If your deck is not included with the permit for your new home, a Deck Permit must be submitted and approved prior to construction.

The Town of Pilot Butte offers residents the opportunity to receive specific municipal notices as attachments in an e-mail rather than by regular mail.

Transmitting information by e-mail has a number of risks that residents should be aware of. These include, but are not limited to, the following:

- E-mail can be circulated, forwarded, and stored in numerous paper and electronic files.
- E-mail can be immediately broadcast worldwide and be received by many intended and unintended recipients.
- E-mail senders can easily misaddress an email.
- E-mail is easier to falsify than handwritten or signed documents.
- Backup copies of e-mail may exist even after the sender or the recipient has deleted their copy.
- E-mail can be intercepted, altered, forwarded, or used without authorization or detection.
- E-mail can be used to introduce viruses into computer systems.
- E-mail can be used as evidence in court.

The Town of Pilot Butte will use reasonable means to protect the security and confidentiality of e-mail information sent and received. However, because of the risks outlined above, the municipality cannot guarantee the security and confidentiality of e-mail communication, and will not be liable for improper disclosure of confidential information. For this reason, the customer must consent to the use of e-mail for delivery of municipal notices.

Consent to the use of e-mail for the delivery of municipal notices includes agreement with the following:

- 1. Failure to receive an e-mailed municipal notice does not release me from my responsibility to pay any charges specified on the notice, or any penalties which may be incurred by late payment.
- 2. I will inform the Town of Pilot Butte of any change in my e-mail address as soon as possible, to prevent the misdirection of notices and reduce the risk of my not receiving a notice.
- 3. I may withdraw from e-mail delivery at any time. To do so I will inform the Town of Pilot Butte, and all notices which were previously e-mailed to me will be sent by regular mail.

Dog-Owners Please Note

The Town Office continues to receive complaints about residents who do not keep their pets on a leash when they are being walked, particularly in a park or in another non-residential area. Please be aware that there is no facility for off-leash dog walking within the Town limits. We would ask that owners be conscious of others who use the parks. It is not pleasant to have a strange dog run up to you or your pet when you are trying to enjoy one of the Town's greenspaces. You are probably sure that your dog is not aggressive, but the other person has no such certainty. As for doggie bags, please, use them. The Town provides doggie bag stations at the entrances to parks. No one else wants to accidently step in, bike over or smell your dog's messes. Small children walk these paths. Even in the winter, there are those who are pushing a baby cart which obstructs vision. Again, how uncomfortable to run over your dog's mess. We appreciate that you love your pets and that they are a part of your family, but, like your children, pet ownership comes with responsibilities.

Whether on walking paths or on the street we ask that all residents exercise courtesy when walking their pets by not allowing them to run free and by picking up defecations.

There are many residents who do perform these courtesies and the Town wishes to recognize and thank them for their commitment to the comfort of their neighbours and community.

LV CHAIR YOGA

In LV chair yoga traditional yoga poses are adapted to be done while seated on a chair. After a skiing injury prevented her from doing mat-based yoga, Kim discovered the benefits of a chair-based yoga practice. The best thing she discovered is that you can use chair yoga in your daily life. Whether you take a few minutes to do some chair yoga at your kitchen table before your morning coffee, or you break up long days of sitting at an office desk with a few poses.

Drinking Water Quality and Compliance

The Water Security Agency and the Ministry of Environment requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Minister's Order or Permit to Operate a waterworks. The following is a summary of the **Town of Pilot Butte's** water quality and sample submission compliance record for the **year of 2021**. This report was completed on **6-Jan-2022**. Readers should refer to Water Security Agency's "Municipal Drinking Water Quality Monitoring Guidelines, June 2015, EPB 502" for more information on minimum sample submission requirements. Permit requirements for a specific waterworks may require more sampling than outlined in the department's monitoring guidelines. The owner/operator is responsible to ensure that 100 per cent of all bacteriological samples are submitted as required. All waterworks are required to submit samples for bacteriological water quality; the frequency of monitoring depends on the population served by the waterworks.

A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual OR 0.5 mg/L total chlorine residual is required at all times throughout the distribution system unless otherwise approved. A proper chlorine submission is defined as a bacteriological sample submission form with both the free and total chlorine residual fields filled out. An adequate chlorine is a result that indicates that the chlorine level is above the regulated minimums. An adequate chlorine may be counted even if the chlorine results were submitted incorrectly. A waterworks is required to submit chlorine residual test results on every bacteriological sample they submit.

A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual is required for water entering the distribution system. Tests are normally performed on a daily basis by the waterworks operator and are to be recorded in operation records. This data includes the number of free chlorine residual tests performed, the overall range of free chlorine residual (highest and lowest recorded values) and the number of tests and percentage of results not meeting the minimum requirement of 0.1 mg/L free chlorine residual.

Turbidity is a measure of water treatment efficiency. Turbidity measures the "clarity" of the drinking water and is generally reported in Nephelometric Turbidity Units (NTU). All waterworks are required to monitor turbidity at the water treatment plant. The frequency of measurement varies from daily for small systems to continuous for larger waterworks.

Substances within the chemical health category may be naturally occurring in drinking water sources or may be the result of human activities. These substances may represent a long-term health risk if the Maximum Acceptable Concentration (MAC) or Interim Maximum Acceptable Concentration (IMAC) is exceeded. All drinking water supplies are required to monitor for substances in the Chemical-Health category, the frequency of monitoring depends on the population served by the waterworks. Some waterworks will add fluoride to drinking water as a means to aid in the prevention of dental decay.

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for SE's General Chemical category once every two years if a ground water source or once per three months every second year if a surface water or blended surface/groundwater source. The General Chemical category includes analysis for alkalinity, bicarbonate, calcium, carbonate, chloride, conductivity, hardness (as CaCO₃), magnesium, sodium, sulphate and total dissolved solids.

The last sample for General Chemical analysis was submitted on 19-Jan-2021. Sample results indicated that there were no exceedences of the provincial aesthetic objectives for the General Chemical category.

*Objectives apply to certain characteristics of or substances found in water for human consumptive or hygienic use. The presence of these substances will affect the acceptance of water by consumers and/or interfere with the practice of supplying good quality water. Compliance with drinking water aesthetic objectives is not mandatory as these objectives are in the range where they do not constitute a health hazards. The aesthetic objectives for several parameters (including hardness as CaCO₃, magnesium, sodium and total dissolved solids) consider regional differences in drinking water sources and quality.

A Note About Waste Collection

There are occasions when the collection of garbage, recycling and compost are delayed and carts are not emptied at the usual times of day. A change of driver or route; a mechanical failure, any number of things may delay the service. Loraas advises that there WILL ALWAYS BE SERVICE. Unless inclement weather makes travelling unsafe, the truck will always come eventually. It may be later that evening, it may be the next morning, but the carts will be emptied. You are always welcome to contact the Town office if your cart has not been collected by the morning of the next day. Occasionally the odd cart or street is missed, but it is not abnormal for the whole town to receive service much later than the usual time. If it is very windy, you may want to bring your cart in for the night and replace it the next morning. Remember too, that Loraas provides service on Mondays and Thursdays regardless of holidays.

Reminder: Compost collection is reduced to the first Monday of every month starting November 1st to March 1st 2022
