
Criteria:

The Town of Pilot Butte adopted

Bylaw 03-2021 A BYLAW RESPECTING THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE.

ATV Registration to begin mid April and the following rules will apply:

- All ATV's operating within Town Limits must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
 Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum speed of 30km/hr.
- The Town recommends that residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from their place of residence.
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are NOT permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.
 - Please contact the Town Office or refer to our website for the Bylaws enforced within the Town of Pilot Butte.





...that your new home may include the header or posts for a deck. This does not indicate that a deck was included with your home build. Your builder is aware whether your deck was included with the build of your home.

If your deck is not included with the permit for your new home, a Deck Permit must be submitted and approved prior to construction.

SEWAGE BLOCKAGE - If you suspect you have a sewer blockage, the line **MUST be checked by the Town Maintenance Staff. Payment may be refused** (at the discretion of the Town Maintenance Director) if this condition is not met. Please call 306-781-4547 - Option 1 during regular office hours. A **maintenance man is on call after hours** *for emergencies* and is available by

2022 ASSESSMENT NOTICES

Assessment notices will be sent out on March 25, 2022. If you have had a building permit issued by the Town in 2021; or if Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) has scheduled your property for a callback inspection; or if the property has changed owners in the last few months, you will receive an assessment notice for 2022.

The assessment provider (SAMA) determines the assessed values of all of the properties in the town.

You may wish to ask for a copy of the detailed property report for your property. The sheet will provide specific details about your property used to calculate your assessment such as:

** Size of buildings;

** Condition of buildings;

** Size of Lot

You can also view your property and other properties by going to the SAMA website at www.sama.sk.ca then click the **MySAMA** & SAMAView Login. Access is free of charge for personal and non-commercial use.

You can appeal if you believe there has been an error in:

You cannot appeal the level of taxes owing to the Town to the Board of Revision. Tax policy is a decision made by Council. Concerns about taxation should be addressed to the Town Office. The Board of Revision hears assessment appeals only.

Please feel free to call SAMA at 306-924-8080 or the Town Office at 306-781-4547 to discuss an appeal prior to completing the notice of appeal form. The discussion may create understanding between the parties on facts or issues surrounding your potential appeal. If you wish to appeal, the fee for an appeal is \$75.00 and refundable if your appeal is successful. Appeals are to be sent to Jeannie Devers, Secretary, Board of Revision, c/o Box 253, 222 Diamond Place, Pilot Butte, SK. SOG 3ZO.

For 2023, letters have been sent out to all residents for reinspection of properties. All residents will be receiving a letter. Please review the documentation when received and contact SAMA, should you have any questions. A copy of your Detailed Property Profile from 2021 is available from the Town Office, should you want to review what you are being assessed for. The Detailed Property Profile was the blue document that was included with your assessment notice in 2021.

Please call the Town Office or email the town at townofpilotbutte@pilotbutte.ca to obtain a copy. Please take a moment to fill out the Residential Property Data Confirmation Form & send it back to SAMA. This will help to ensure your assessment (and therefore your taxes) are as accurate as possible. Thank you.

Yard Maintenance Policy

Purpose of Policy:

The Town of Pilot Butte's Yard Maintenance Policy was created so that residents can enjoy a safe and attractive community while also creating a predictable enforcement process. The Town of Pilot Butte recognizes the importance of the appearance and amenity of the entire Town and has implemented this policy to encourage landowners to keep their lots tidy throughout the summer months. This policy will adhere to the Town of Pilot Butte Bylaw No. 14–2005.

Scope of Policy:

This Policy is effective throughout the entire Town on residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and vacant lots.

Inspections:

- Grass and weeds will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- Untidy and Unsightly properties will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- If, upon inspection, the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate determines a lot requires maintenance, the Town will arrange to have the lot maintained after following the notifications process stated in Section 4: Notification
- Inspections of residential subdivisions will occur on the dates stated in Schedule A: Inspection Dates, which are subject to change annually.
- Inspections of other untidy and unsightly yards causing a nuisance will occur as complaints are received.
- Inspections will be done on the following dates: June 15, July 20, August 17 and September 30.

Our new program is under way and we would like to remind all residents of the items that are <u>accepted</u> and the items that are **not**.

Wood and tree limbs have become an issue in the composting process, so we want to be more clear on these particular items. NO construction material can be placed in the green cart – specifically, Lumber. NO tree limbs larger than 1' thick or longer than 2 feet are to be placed in the green cart.

With the new process, a grinder is used at one of the stages and it is not able to break down large pieces of wood.

Group Messaging System

The Town of Pilot Butte uses the Group West Broadcasting System to send out items of general interest. Examples of notices sent using this system include but are not limited to; Town events, road closures, policy or procedure changes which affect residents and local emergency alerts. The Town does not use this system for private events or for lost animal notifications.

Residents can receive notifications through a phone call, email or both. Emailed messages often include links that direct residents to the Town website for further information. For phone messages, the Town provides a guide on how to find the information on the website.

(Under category type select ADMINISTRATION and under request type select SYNREVOICE/GROUP WEST. Be sure to indicate in the request details how you want to receive your message; via email or phone call or both.



PUBLIC NOTICE TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE

Notice of Intent to add Cannabis Use in all Commercial Districts and adopt the Bylaw No. 2-2022.

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Pilot Butte intends to amend the Zoning Bylaw 18-2017, under *The Planning and Development Act, 2007*, by adopting the Bylaw No. 2-2022.

INTENT:

To add "cannabis" as one of discretionary uses in all commercial districts, which are C1, C2, and C3 districts, as depicted in orange color and presented as Schedule "A" in the proposed Bylaw No. 2-2022. Definitions concerning "cannabis" are also part of proposed additions to the Town's Zoning Bylaw in effect.

REASON:

The reason for the Bylaw amendment is to accommodate federally/provincially licensed cannabis retail operations in all commercial districts designated within the Pilot Butte's boundary. The Bylaw No. 2-2022 is set to provide standards and regulations for any cannabis retail developments. Future Cannabis Retail Outlets will be required to comply with the prescribed development standards and regulations stated



in the Bylaw. Additional conditions of approval may be required at the discretion of the Council, provided that "Cannabis Retail Outlet" is to be listed as a "discretionary use" only in commercial districts.

PUBLIC INSPECTION:

Any person may inspect the proposed Bylaw No. 2-2022 at the Town Office: 222 Diamond Place, Pilot Butte, SK SOG 3Z0 between 9 am to 12 noon and 1 pm to 5 pm from Monday to Thursday, and between 9 am to 12 noon on Friday, excluding statutory holidays. Copies are available at Town Office. The Bylaw will also be available at www.pilotbutte.ca.

REPRESENTATIONS:

The Municipality is open in accepting any written representations from the public that states their concerns or comments regarding the proposed Bylaw No. 2-2022. Written representations or any other forms with your full name and civic address shall be submitted no later than April 7, 2022 to the Town Office or email to planner@pilotbutte.ca.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Council will hold a public hearing for the proposed Bylaw No. 2-2022 at 7:00 p.m. (local time) on Monday, April 11, 2022, in the Town Office to hear any concerns from the public whether in-person or virtual. Please send us an email to planner@pilotbutte.ca with your full name and civic address no later than April 7, 2022, confirming if you will attend and speak during the public hearing so that we can save your spot.

Discolouration in the Water Update

The Town of Pilot Butte utilized water treatment industry experts to investigate the discolouration of water some residents are experiencing.

- The industry experts confirmed that the water treatment plant is producing a safe water supply that is exceeding the water testing requirements required by the Province, which includes daily testing of Chlorine and pH levels, and turbidity twice a day.
- The investigation concluded that a small amount of minerals (iron and manganese) is causing the discoloration. The Town will continue to monitor and remediate with the guidance of the industry experts.

If you have noticed discoloration in your hot water, flushing your hot water tank or your on-demand heater may temporarily get rid of the problem. If you have noticed discoloration in your cold water you can call the Town Office at (306) 781-4547 and request a service line flush.






