We are also offering an opportunity for you to make some money for your group or charity organization, this year we will pay you \$12.00 per hour that you work.



The Town of Pilot Butte adopted:

Bylaw 03-2021 A BYLAW RESPECTING THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE.

ATV Registration to begin mid April and the following rules will apply:

- All ATV's operating within Town Limits must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
 Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum speed of 30km/hr.
- The Town recommends that residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from their place of residence.
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are NOT permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.
 - Please contact the Town Office or refer to our website for the Bylaws enforced within the Town of Pilot Butte.





...that your new home may include the header or posts for a deck. This does not indicate that a deck was included with your home build. Your builder is aware whether your deck was included with the build of your home.

If your deck is not included with the permit for your new home, a Deck Permit must be submitted and approved prior to construction.

It's Summer and you are beautifying your yard, building a deck or renovating your house. Doesn't it feel good to get at those projects? The Town would like to remind residents that the streets and sidewalks are to be shared with pedestrians and traffic. Please ensure that all construction materials are placed and stored in your yard or driveway, and inform your contractor of this before they bring in supplies.

The Town also asks that you dispose of any garbage through the proper means.

Do not dispose of garbage or left over material in parks or public land. This includes grass clippings.

The Town thanks you all for you cooperation and looks forward to seeing your beautiful yards.

Yard Maintenance Policy

Purpose of Policy:

The Town of Pilot Butte's Yard Maintenance Policy was created so that residents can enjoy a safe and attractive community while also creating a predictable enforcement process. The Town of Pilot Butte recognizes the importance of the appearance and amenity of the entire Town and has implemented this policy to encourage landowners to keep their lots tidy throughout the summer months. This policy will adhere to the Town of Pilot Butte Bylaw No. 14-2005.

Scope of Policy:

This Policy is effective throughout the entire Town on residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and vacant lots.

Inspections:

- Grass and weeds will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- Untidy and Unsightly properties will be monitored by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate.
- If, upon inspection, the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or delegate determines a lot requires maintenance, the Town will arrange to have the lot maintained after following the notifications process stated in Section 4: Notification
- Inspections of residential subdivisions will occur on the dates stated in Schedule A: Inspection Dates, which are subject to change annually.
- Inspections of other untidy and unsightly yards causing a nuisance will occur as complaints are received.
- Inspections will be done on the following dates: June 15, July 20, August 17 and September 30.

Construction Codes Advisory

Promoting construction of safe, healthy, habitable buildings

Carbon Monoxide and Smoke Alarms – Protecting People in Their Homes

Information at a Glance

Effective July 1, 2022, all *buildings* in Saskatchewan with sleeping rooms are required to provide early warning protection against the effects of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, smoke and fire.

The installation of CO and smoke alarms is the most effective way of accomplishing this requirement.

When a *building* with sleeping rooms contains a fuel-burning *appliance*, or an attached vehicle parking garage. CO alarms must be installed:

- inside each sleeping room; OR
- outside each sleeping room within 5 meters (16 feet) of each sleeping room door.

When a building contains sleeping rooms, smoke

addressed in this advisory. Words in Italic,
other than Act and Regulation titles are
defined in the NBC 2015.

alarms must be installed:

on each floor level of a building, including the level with sleeping rooms, with the smoke alarm located between the sleeping rooms and the remainder of the floor, AND

inside each sleeping room.

An example house, that meets the new requirements for CO alarms and smoke alarms, is shown below.

Discolouration in the Water Update

The Town of Pilot Butte utilized water treatment industry experts to investigate the discolouration of water some residents are experiencing.

- The industry experts confirmed that the water treatment plant is producing a safe water supply that is exceeding the water testing requirements required by the Province, which includes daily testing of Chlorine and pH levels, and turbidity twice a day
- The investigation concluded that a small amount of minerals (iron and manganese) is causing the discoloration. The Town will continue to monitor and remediate with the guidance of the industry experts.

If you have noticed discoloration in your hot water, flushing your hot water tank or your on-demand heater may temporarily get rid of the problem. If you have noticed discoloration in your cold water you can call the Town Office at (306) 781-4547 and request a service line flush.




June, July and August are quieter times at the center. Rentals are welcome and usually a BBQ or two will take place.



Dr. Bob Bors is a Professor at the U of S where he teaches classes on Fruit Science, Plant Propagation, Greenhouse Management and Introduction to Horticulture. His research involves breeding hardy fruits for northern areas. His program has 40 acres of fruit and a 93-year history of developing varieties for Northern Canada and is the coldest location in North America for a major fruit breeding program. In recent years his program has released 5 sour cherries, 4 apples and 8 Haskap varieties.
