ELECTION DAY POLLS: Wednesday, November 13, 2024.

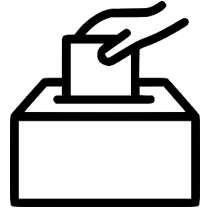
Polls will be open from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm.

Council Candidate Information

Nominations will be accepted

until Wednesday, October 9, 2024 from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Eligibility Requirements to Run for Council:

- On or before election day, you are 18 years of age or will be 18 years of age;
- You are a Canadian citizen;
- Have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which this nomination paper is submitted; and
- Have resided in the municipality, or on land now in the municipality, for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which this nomination paper is submitted.
- Are not disqualified by *The Local Government Election Act, 2015* or any other Act from holding office for which you are a candidate.

Candidate Nomination Forms are available on the Town website; via email or for pick up at the Town Office.

In addition to the Nomination Form, candidates must submit a Criminal Record Check as per the Town of Pilot Butte Bylaw No. 8-2012, including the Results of Criminal Record Check for Candidate for Election along with a Public Disclosure Statement.

Running for Municipal Office – What You Need to Know and Running for Municipal Office information on Council responsibilities, is available on the Town website; via email or for pick up at the Town Office.

Nomination Papers, Candidates Acceptance, Criminal Record Check (Contact RCMP), Results of Criminal Record Check for Candidate for Election (Form B.1) and the Public Disclosure Statement can be submitted by email to the general@pilotbutte.ca, personally or by agent by personal service to the Town Office – Pilot Butte Recreation Complex, by registered mail or by ordinary mail to Box 253, Pilot Butte, SK S0G 3Z0, or as otherwise specified by the returning officer, **no later than Wednesday, October 9, 2024 by 4:00 pm.**

Voter Information

Who Can Vote?

- You are a Canadian citizen;
- You will be 18 years of age or will attain the full age of 18 years on or before election day;
- You will have resided for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election in or on land now in the Town of Pilot Butte; or
- You will have been the owner for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election of assessable land situated in the municipality or of land now in the municipality; and
- You have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

Would you prefer to Mail-In Your Ballot?

- Any eligible voter can request a mail-in ballot for ease of voting and/or if you prefer to limit contact with other persons - all from the comfort of your home.
- Eligible voters who desire to vote by mail shall apply in person, by mail or electronically to the Town Office no later than October 9, 2024 at 4:00 pm.
- This end date allows for ample time for mailing out the ballot kit if personal service is not available. Mail-in Ballots must be delivered to the Returning Officer before 8:00 pm on Election Day.
- The mail-in ballot request form is available on the Town website or at the Town Office. The Town can email or mail you the ballot request forms as long as they are returned to the Town Office by October 9, 2024 at 4:00 pm.

Voter's Registration Form – What is This Form For?

- The town does not have a voter's list so every voter **MUST** fill out a Voter's Registration Form in order to receive a ballot and vote for their candidate.
- To make voting quick and easy and safe for all persons involved in the election process, it is highly recommended that you print and fill out your Voter's Registration Form prior to coming to the poll and then bring it with you to the poll filled out **BUT NOT SIGNED**.
- Please **DO NOT** sign the form until you get to the poll – the DRO is required to witness your signature. Thank you. Voter Registration Forms will also be available at the Advance Polls and Regular Polls.
- The Voter's Registration Form – Form R can be found on the Town website or it can be emailed to you or phone the Town Office to pick up a copy. Please bring your own pen to fill out the form with.

What Identification Do I Need to Vote?

- A government-issued photo ID that shows your name and address (does not need to indicate physical address); or
- Two pieces of government-issued ID – one that shows your name and another that shows your name and address
